Dates: February 26 ,2026 to March 1; 2026

Host: Port Malabar Rifle & Pistol Club. NRA #C1034

Location: Port Malabar Rifle & Pistol Club is in the city of Palm Bay, FL. Located At 610 Hurley Blvd SW Palm Bay FL, 32908.

Directions: take I-95 to exit 173, Malabar Road, State Rd. 514. Follow Malabar Rd. Westbound for 4.8 miles to Hurley Blvd SW. Turn left onto Hurley Blvd SW. and follow the road to the Port Malabar Rifle and Pistol Club gate at the end of the road.

Rules: All current year published F-Class rules will apply

Eligibility: Open to anyone

Entry: Electronic registration and payment only, you will receive an email confirmation. Registration and Match Program will be available at www.pmrpcrifle.com

Entry fees: Cost of Registration is \$150.00 for individual competitor, \$75.00 for Juniors, and \$25 per team member for the team match. Match fees will include awards banquet.

Entries close: Entries must be received by 2/20/2026

Post entries: no walk-on or post entries allowed.

Entry limit: Entries are limited to 68 competitors.

Refunds: Entry fees will be refunded if an email cancelation (required) is received one week prior to the match. 50% of match fees will be refunded if cancelation is received the week of the match. There will be no refunds for no shows.

Rifles: F-Class Open Rifle (F-O) Rule 3.1(a)
F-Class Target Rifle (F-TR) Rule 3.1(b)



Targets: 600 yards MR-1FC

Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI) must be inserted into the chamber of all rifles entering the facility/property of Port Malabar Rifle & Pistol Club. This is a Club rule and will be enforced. ECIs must remain in place until preparation period is given, and reinserted prior to rifles being removed from the firing line.

Scoring: All competitors are required to score. The Shot Marker Scoring System will be used. Competitors should bring an electronic device capable of connecting to the Range WiFi, accessing a webpage by IP address with sufficient power for at least 5 hours. **While keeping score, scorekeepers should be aware all rounds must be accounted for. Any missing shots, cross-fires, extra shots – should be reported immediately. The competitor should be aware all rounds must be accounted for. Any missing shots, cross-fires, extra-shots – stop, ensure the scorekeeper is reporting this. Wait for further instruction. Failure to do so could result in a zero for the competitor for that shot. There are no provisional shots**

Check In, Team Match & Sight In: Thursday February 26, 2026, starting at **6:00am**, check in for Teams and individuals starts. Teams and individuals will be able to pick up their match packet at the Stat Shack. **8:30am** team matches begin, with a block time of 100 minutes per match and a **15-minute** brake between each match. **After** the team matches have concluded, there will be an individual sight-in period at the 600-yard line. This will be a supervised sight-in with a **20-minute time limit per shooter for a period of one hour.**

Squadding: Day 1 squadding will be done by classification and rifle type. Competitors will be squadded by score on Day 2 & Day 3. Squadding will be posted daily.

Course Of Fire:

Team Matches: Team Matches will be **February 26, 2026** starting at **8:30am** consisting of **3 matches, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record** for Each firing member of the team with a **block time of 100 minutes for each match.** Teams will have an assigned target. Rule 8.3(a); & Rule 11.6.8 will apply to all team matches.

Individual matches: Individual matches will be **February 27th, 28th and March 1, 2026**, starting at **8:00 AM.** The **First** match of **each day** will be **unlimited sighters with 20 shots for record in a time limit of 25 minutes.** The **second** and **third** matches of **each day** will be **2 sighters with 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes.**



2/26/2026 Team Match Day and check-in

Check-in begins/pickup Match Packet. Rifles will be weighed, front rest for F-open, bipod board and bipod for FTR and rear bag setups will be checked at this time as well.

8:30 am Team Matches

Match T1: 4-Man Team Match; 600 yds; 2 sighters and 20 shots for record per shooter; block time of 100 mins.

Match T2: 4-Man Team Match; 600 yds; 2 sighters and 20 shots for record per shooter; block time of 100 mins.

Match T3: 4-Man Team Match; 600 yds; 2 sighters and 20 shots for record per shooter; block time of 100 mins.

Match T4: Grand Aggregate Match T1, T2, T3

45 minutes after the Team matches have concluded: supervised sight in and individual practice begins for a one-hour period. 20 minutes per shooter.

Match 1: Individual fire; 600 yards; unlimited sighters; 20 shots for record; 25 min time limit

Match 2: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

Match 3: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

2/28/2026 Day 2: 7:00am Check-in, Daily Awards, & Safety Briefing, shooting starts at 8:00 am

Match 5: Individual fire; 600 yards; unlimited sighters; 20 shots for record; 25 min time limit

Match 6: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

Match 7: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

Match 8: Aggregate Match 5 – Match 7

3/1/2026 Day 3: 7:00am Check-in, Daily Awards, & Safety Briefing, shooting starts at 8:00 am

Match 9: Individual fire; 600 yards; unlimited sighters; 20 shots for record; 25 min time limit

Match 10: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

Match 11: Individual fire; 600 yards; 2 sighters; 20 shots for record; 22 min time limit

Match 12: Aggregate Match 9 – Match 11

Match 13: Grand Aggregate Match 4, Match 8, Match 12



Awards:

First, second and third overall by rifle type – not eligible for any other awards· First, second and third

Class awards, i.e. HM, MA, EX, SS, MK, by rifle type – not eligible for any other awards

First, second and third category awards by rifle type – if there are enough competitors

Recognized Category Awards are: Senior, Grand Senior, Woman, Veteran, Police and Junior

5 competitors required for first place, 10 competitors required for second place, 15 competitors required for third place

Classes may be combined, except for High Master.

Match awards will be presented at the end of the challenge period – on the day they are shot.

All competitors are eligible for Cold Bore X coins – A Cold Bore X is the first round shot for the day in the “X” ring , on your target.

The Awards Banquet will take place at the PMRPC Pavilion directly after the challenge period of the final Match.

PMRPC does offer approx. 12 camper sites with electric hook up at the cost of \$10 per day. Tent camping is free. Please contact rifle@pmrpc.com to reserve a spot.

Gate keys will be made available to non-members on check-in day for a deposit of \$20. Each and returned at the end of the competition and before the banquet.
