The Action Area is Special

- **No static firing line** — shooters are not fixed to a single position.
- **Holster draw is permitted** — the only range at PMRPC where drawing and firing from a holster is allowed.
- **Movement is allowed** — shooters may move throughout the bay and engage targets from multiple positions.
- **180-degree engagement arc** — targets may be engaged anywhere within the safe 180° arc.
- **Shared bays** — multiple shooters may use the same bay simultaneously.

Four Basic Rules of Firearm Safety

- Treat **all** guns like they are always loaded!
- **Never** point muzzle at anything you are not willing to destroy.
- Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.
- Identify your target, and what is behind it.

Firearm Safety Tips

- **Always personally verify that the firearm is unloaded** before handling it. Never rely on someone else's check.
- **Maintain muzzle awareness at all times.** The firearm must always be pointed in a safe direction.
- **Do not hand a firearm to another person** until *you* have visually and physically confirmed that the chamber and magazine well are empty.
- **When transferring a firearm,** ensure the muzzle is pointed away from all people and away from any surface that could cause a ricochet.

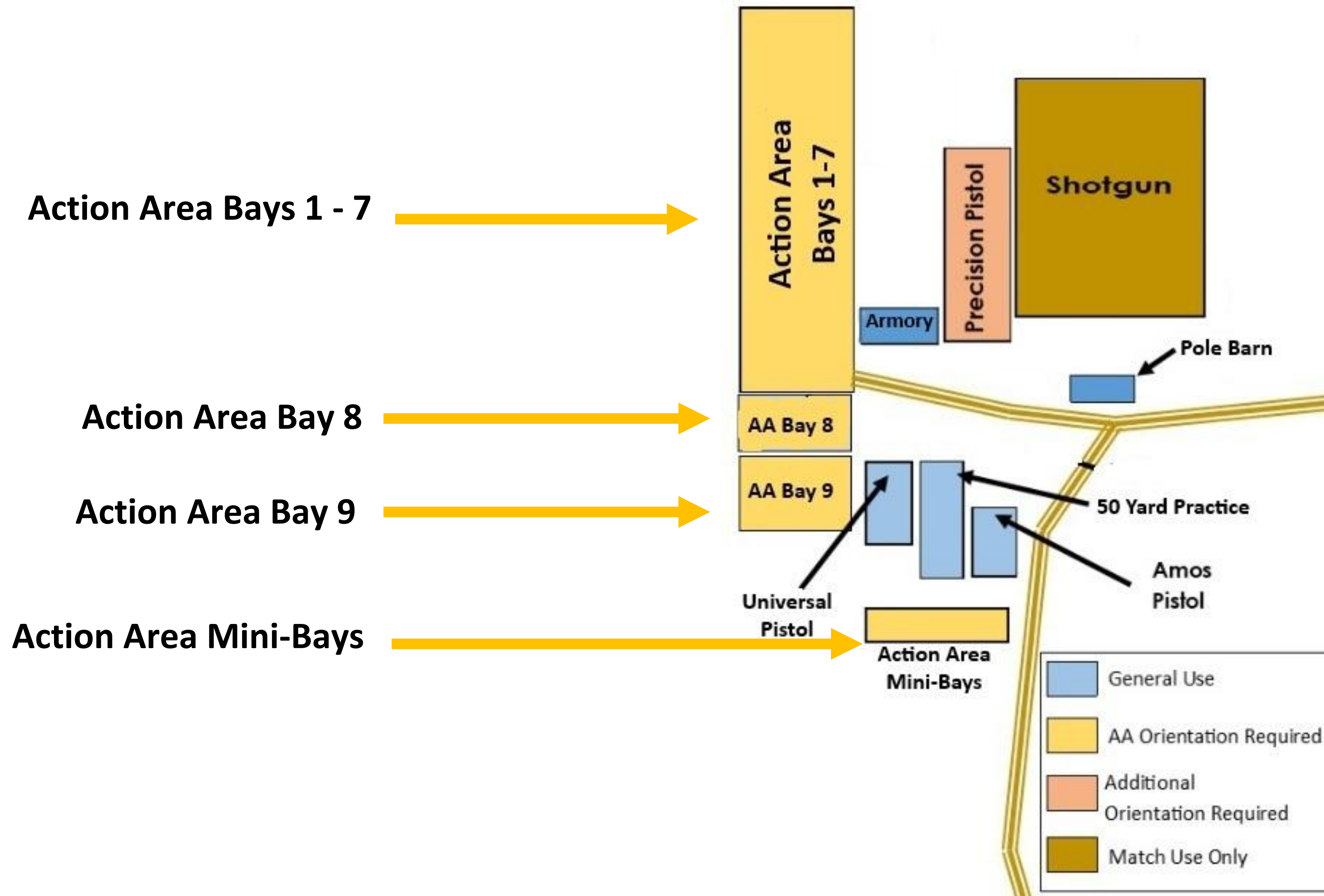

Main Action Area (Bays 1 – 9)



Walk-in Gate

- Electric gate uses the same badge as the front gate.
- You must swipe to enter and exit.
- Do Not stop in path of gate.
- Do Not enter if gate is closing.
- No Tailgating, except for guests following you in.

AA Mini-Bays

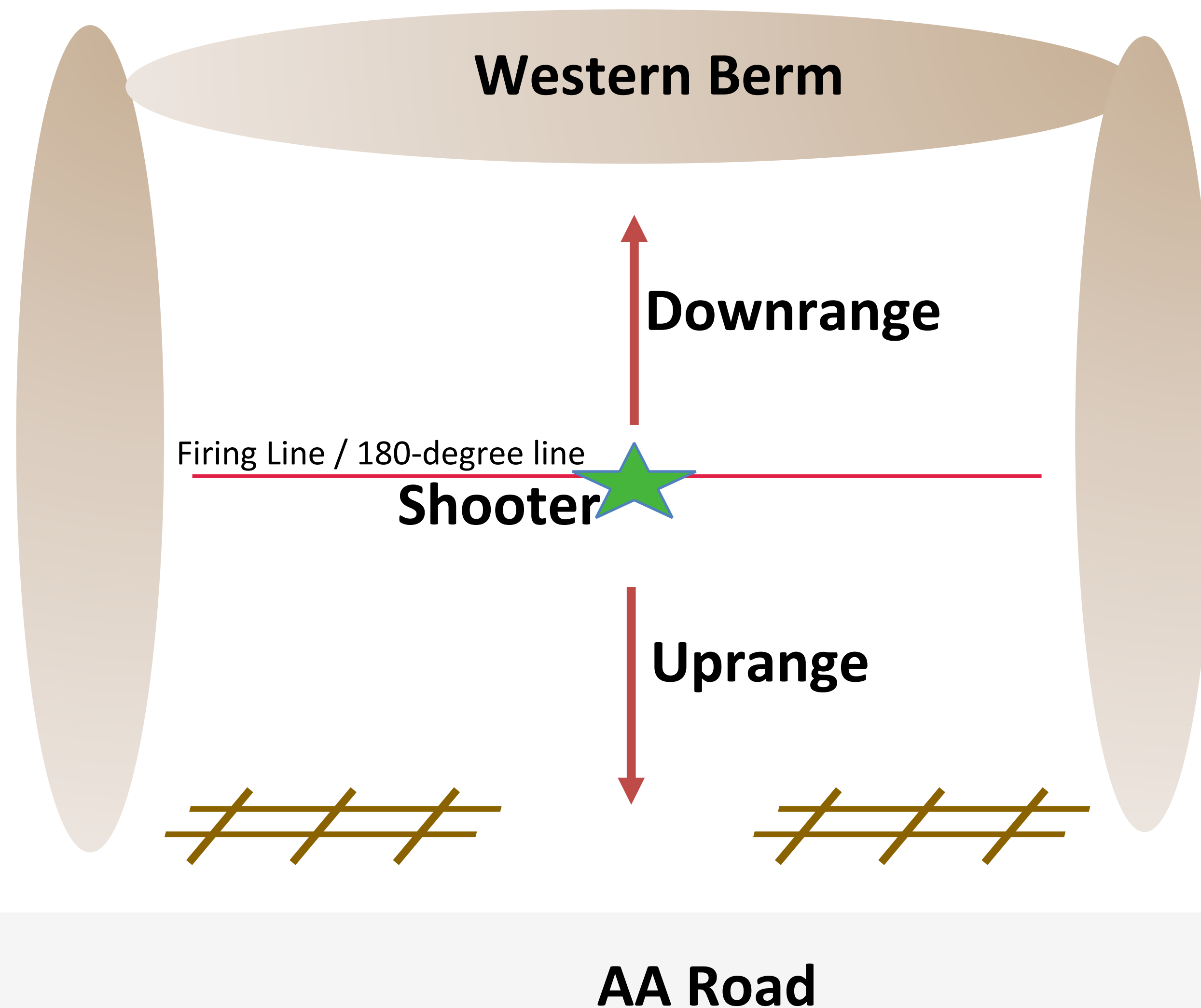


- No rifle-caliber firearms, No shotguns.
- Bullets may not impact side berms.
- No personal steel.
- Not normally used for competition.

Terminology

- **Safe** – the condition in which a firearm cannot fire.
 - firearm is unloaded and magazine removed, if possible
 - slide locked to the rear, or cylinder/action open
 - chamber flag installed, if possible.
- **Safely encased** – firearm is in a holster or case that prevents the trigger from being activated.
 - A holstered gun is considered safely encased.
 - **Outside an AA Bay**, the gun must be **unloaded**
 - **Inside an AA Bay**, the gun may be **loaded**
- **Safe direction** – the direction in which a firearm would do the least damage if discharged.

Terminology



DownRange: Any point between the shooter and the back berm is “downrange”

UpRange: Any point between the shooter and the Action Area road is “uprange”

Firing Line/180-degree line: is a line through the shooters body that is parallel to the back berm.

General

- The first shooter entering the Action Area each day must raise the flag to indicate the area is in use.
 - One flag covers **Bays 1–7**
 - One flag for **Bay 8**
 - One flag for **Bay 9**
- The last person leaving the Action Area must lower the flag.
- The last person leaving the Mini-Bay area must **close and lock the gate and lower the flag.**
- If you open the Action Area walk-through gate, **you are responsible** for closing and locking it when you leave.
- All shooting must occur **inside the fence rails**. Covered areas are **outside** the fence rails and are **not** shooting positions.

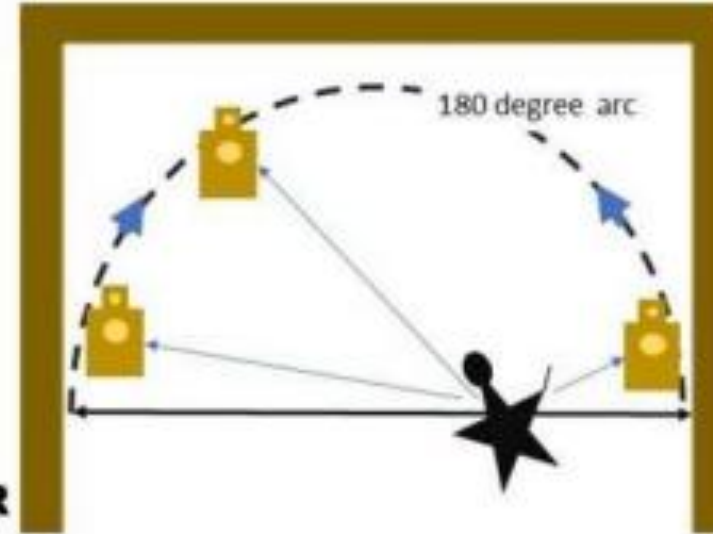
The Action Area

- Eye protection is required at all times inside the gate.
- Ear protection is required when near shooting.
- Scheduled events take priority over casual use of this range.
- Use of action bays during an event is at the discretion of the Match Director.
 - During a match, AA certified members may use open bays ONLY with the specific permission of the Match Director. *Ask first!*
 - *Don't drive into AA during a match without asking – park outside AA.*
- Most matches are staged in bays 1-7.
- Some events such as Steel Challenge and Multi-Gun use Bay 8 and/or Bay 9 as well.

The Rules

ACTION AREA

- READ & UNDERSTAND "GENERAL RULES" & "TERMS AND DEFINITIONS" BEFORE USING RANGE.
- RAISE RANGE FLAG, UNLOCK GATE & OPEN, WHEN RANGE IN USE. FLAG LOWERED & GATE LOCKED, WHEN SHOOTERS NO LONGER PRESENT.
- SCHEDULED SHOOTING ACTIVITIES TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER CASUAL USE OF BAYS.
- DURING MATCH, USE OF OPEN BAYS FOR CASUAL SHOOTING AT MATCH DIRECTOR DISCRETION.
- IN NON-MATCH TIMES, BAYS SET UP FOR MATCH MAY BE USED. PROPS, TARGET STANDS, AND STEEL SET UP MUST NOT BE MOVED; MATCH STEEL MUST NOT BE SHOT AT.
- SHOOTERS MUST ALWAYS FOLLOW THE 180-DEGREE LINE RULE..
- DRAWING FROM A HOLSTER IS ALLOWED.
- MULTIPLE SHOOTERS ARE ALLOWED IN A BAY.
- ALL SHOOTING CONDUCTED FROM A SINGLE FIRING LINE.
- FIRST PERSON IN BAY CONTROLS WHO ELSE CAN SHOOT IN THE BAY.
- EYE PROTECTION REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES; BEWARE FALLING SHOT FROM SHOTGUN FIELDS.
- HEARING PROTECTION IS REQUIRED NEAR SHOOTING.
- IF YOU DAMAGE SOMETHING, NOTIFY A CLUB OFFICIAL BEFORE LEAVING THE PREMISES.
- PERSONAL STEEL MUST BE APPROVED BY THE PISTOL DIRECTOR OR DESIGNEE.
- MINIMUM SAFE DISTANCE FOR SHOOTING AT STEEL IS 10 YARDS.
- STEEL CANNOT BE ENGAGED FROM MORE THAN A 15-DEGREE ANGLE OFF PERPENDICULAR.
- ALL SHOOTING MUST OCCUR FROM INSIDE THE RAIL FENCE OF ACTION BAYS.
- VEHICLES MAY NOT BE PARKED IN HOT BAY.
- ONLY 1 VEHICLE PARKED PER NORTH BAYS 1-3. DO NOT BLOCK ROAD.
- ALL FIREARMS NOT IN USE MUST BE FLAGGED OR CASED. HOLSTERED PISTOLS ARE SAFE.
- RULES MAY CHANGE DURING SCHEDULED EVENTS.
- ACTION AREA-QUALIFIED MEMBERS MAY BRING NON-ACTION AREA-QUALIFIED MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBER GUESTS; ALL PMRPC RULES FOR GUESTS APPLY. YOU MUST INDIVIDUALLY SUPERVISE THEM DIRECTLY (WITHIN ARM'S REACH).



FIREARM HANDLING OUTSIDE THE BAYS INCLUDING SHELTERS:

- NO HANDLING OF UN-SAFE FIREARMS INCLUDING UNDER SHELTERS.
- FIREARMS MUST ARRIVE AND LEAVE ACTION BAYS IN A SAFE CONDITION.
- SAFE FIREARMS MAY BE MOVED FROM BAY TO BAY, WITH MUZZLES POINTED DOWN.

FIREARM HANDLING INSIDE THE BAYS:

- MUZZLES MUST NEVER POINT ABOVE THE BERM.
- MUZZLES ALWAYS POINT DOWNRANGE OR IN SAFE DIRECTION. MUZZLES ONLY POINT UP WHEN SHOOTERS ARE LOADING A MUZZLELOADER.
- TARGETS MUST BE PLACED SO SHOTS IMPACT DIRECTLY INTO BERM.
- HOLSTERED PISTOLS, HOT OR EMPTY, ARE SAFELY ENCASED.
- SHOOTERS MAY MOVE ABOUT BAY WITH A LOADED, HOLSTERED PISTOL.

FOR BLACK POWDER / MUZZLELOADERS:

- NO SMOKING ALLOWED WITHIN 10 FEET OF BLACK POWDER / POWDER PELLETS.
- POWDER CAN ONLY BE LOADED FROM A SEPARATE MEASURE.
- PISTOL LOADING MUST USE STAND TO HOLD FIREARM VERTICAL.
- NO OPEN POWDER OR PELLET CONTAINERS ALLOWED AT SHOOTING TABLES.
- CLEAN UP SHOOTING TABLES OF ALL SPILLED POWDER IMMEDIATELY. POWDER SPILLED ON THE GROUND MUST BE WELL SCATTERED.

SUBMACHINE GUNS

- USE OF SUBMACHINE GUNS REQUIRES AT LEAST TWO PEOPLE PRESENT; ONE MUST BE PMRPC-APPROVED NFA RANGE OFFICER.
- SELECT-FIRE FIREARMS MUST BE CHAMBERED FOR PISTOL ROUNDS ONLY.
- NO AUTOMATIC WEAPONS CHAMBERED FOR RIFLE CARTRIDGES FIRED AT PMRPC WITHOUT BOARD'S APPROVAL.
- NO BUMPFIRE STOCKS, BINARY TRIGGERS OR DEVICES THAT SIMULATE AUTOMATIC FIRE ALLOWED.

Guests

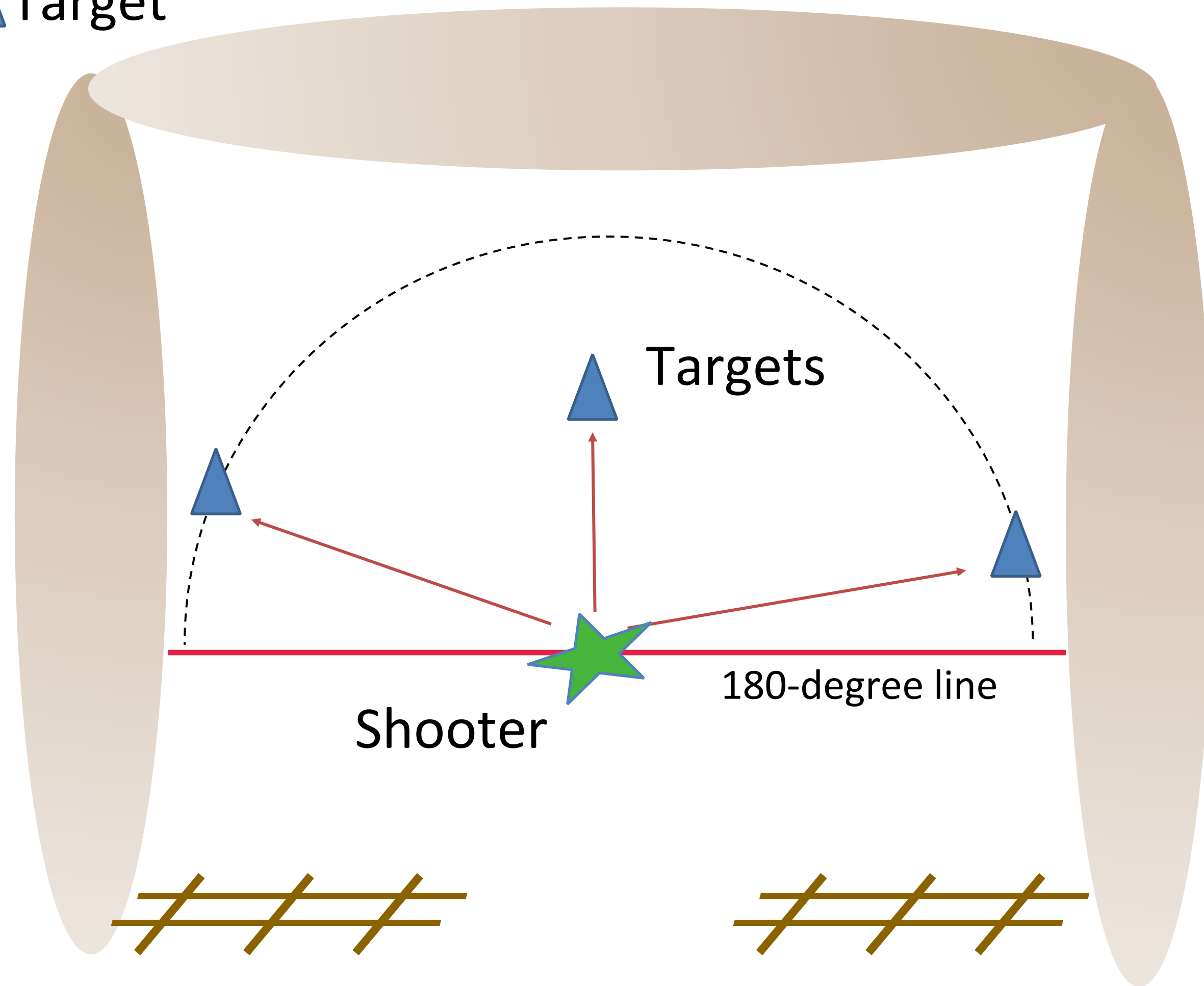
- **Anyone you bring into the Action Area who is not AA certified is your “guest,” and you must directly supervise them:**
 - **No more than three “guests.”**
 - **You can’t shoot while they shoot.**
 - **You must be within arm’s reach when guests are shooting or handling a firearm.**
- **Please be aware that it is very important that any guest complete a Hold Harmless Agreement (HHA) before coming to the range.**
 - **There are 3 ways to complete the HHA:**
 - **-Electronically Online HHA is preferred.**
 - **It is available on PMRPC.COM website under Important Information**
 - **Paper copy available at the Gate House.**
 - **Paper copy available in the Pole Barn.**

The 180-Degree Rule

- **With the shooter directly facing the downrange (Western berm in main AA) berm, the shooter can fire at any target within a 180-degree arc.**
- **At NO time can the muzzle of weapon break the 180-degree arc and point uprange.**
- **If the muzzle is pointed straight down, it is not breaking the 180-degree rule.**

Single Shooter

▲ Target



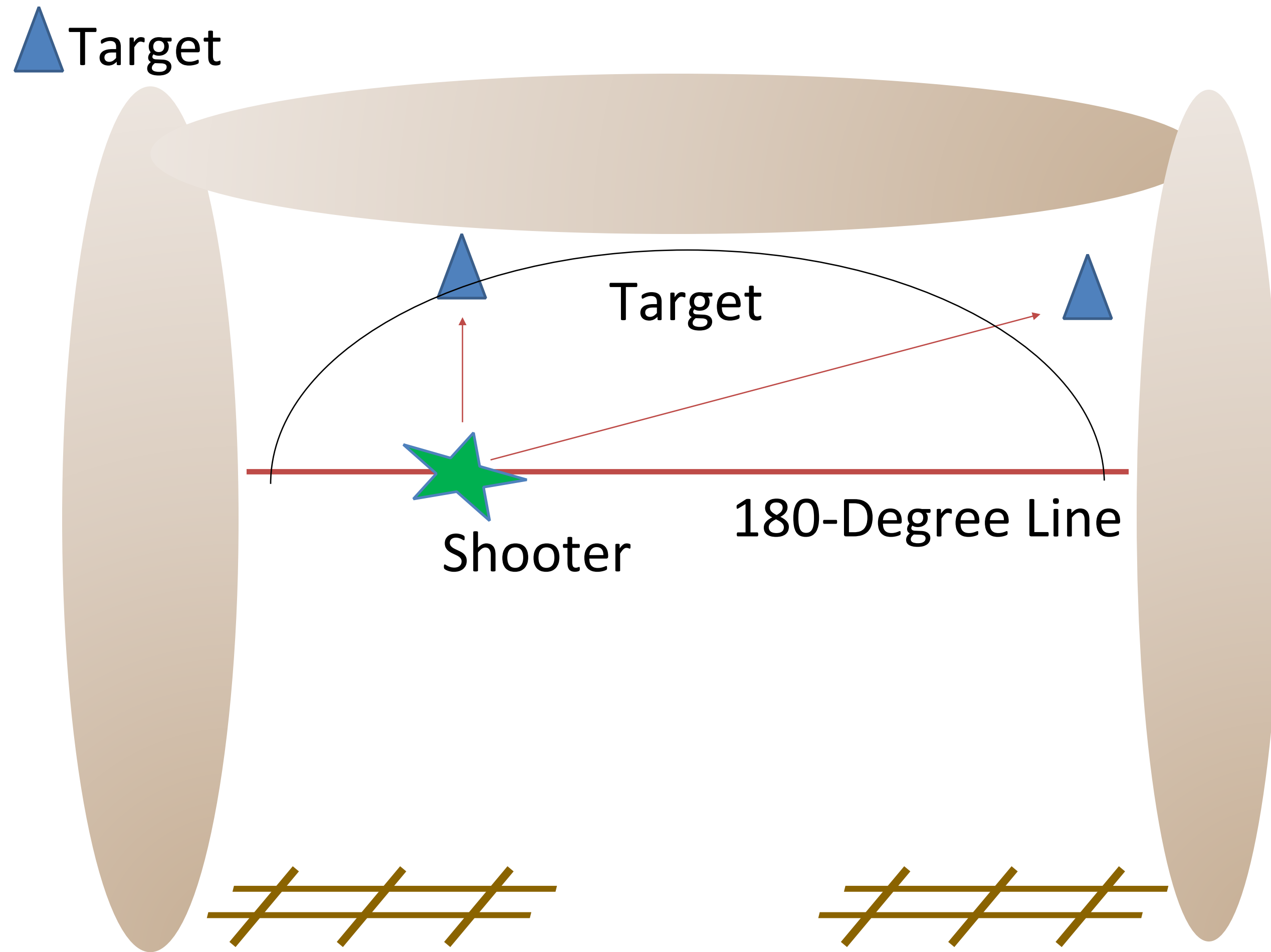
No one can be downrange of 180-Degree Line

Single Shooter



- The 180-degree line moves with the shooter.
- If the shooter moves downrange, the 180-degree line moves downrange.

Allowed Firearms (Bays 1-9)

- All pistols and rifles less than 50 BMG
- Rifle-caliber cartridges - paper and clay only.
- Pistol-caliber cartridges - paper, clay or steel.
- .22 Rimfire - paper, clay and steel.
- Air pistols and air rifles - paper and clay only.
- Shotgun -- slug and buckshot - paper and clay only.
 - **LEAD Birdshot at paper, clay, or steel (7 ½ to 9)**
- No open black powder containers are allowed on the benches.
- No incendiary or explosive cartridges are allowed.
- No explosive targets are allowed.
- 5.7x28 is considered a rifle caliber and can not be shot at steel.

Allowed Firearms (Mini-bays)

- **Pistols chambered in pistol calibers**
- **Rifles chambered in pistol caliber cartridges only**
- **Rifles chambered in .22 Rimfire**
- **Air pistols (on paper and clay only)**

- **No Rifle calibers**
- **No shotgun**
- **No air pistols on steel**

Gun Handling **Outside** the Bays

- All firearms must be brought to the bays made "**safe**" or "**safely encased**"
 - "**Safe**" means:
 - the firearm is unloaded and magazine removed (if possible),
 - slide is locked to the rear or cylinder/action opened or
 - chamber flag installed.
 - "**Safely encased**" means that **an unloaded** gun is in a holster or case that prevents the trigger from being activated.
 - **With 1 exception I will cover shortly in Concealed Carry Waiver**
- A loaded firearm inside the bay cannot be moved outside the bay.
- If a firearm is moved outside a bay while it is not encased, it must be made safe and carried muzzle down.

Gun Handling **Inside** the Bays

- Gun must always be pointed in a safe direction.
- The “**safe direction**” is the direction in which a firearm would do the least damage if discharged. Guns should be handled so that the muzzle is pointing at the berm and bullets will impact directly into it.
- If a muzzle is not pointed downrange, it should be pointed directly at the ground – never up!
- A holstered gun is considered safely encased.
 - **Inside the bay, a holstered gun may be loaded.**
- Shooters may go downrange to change targets with a loaded, holstered handgun.

Gun Handling **Inside** the Bays

- Do Not go downrange with unattended LOADED firearms on a range table.
- **NEVER** place yourself or another person in front of a loaded firearm.
- Unattended firearms must be **Safe** or **safely Encased**.
 - “**Safe**” means:
 - the firearm is unloaded and magazine removed (if possible),
 - slide is locked to the rear or cylinder/action opened or
 - chamber flag installed.
 - “**Safely encased**” means that the gun is in a holster or case that prevents the trigger from being activated.

Range Conduct & Cleanup Requirements

- **NO MUZZLES OVER THE BERMS — EVER.** This is a zero-tolerance safety rule.
- **Brass & Shell Cleanup** You must pick up all empty cartridge cases and shotgun shells and place them in the trash cans. **Clean up your bay before leaving.**
- Shooters must remove all used targets before leaving the range.
- Bays set up for events may be used for practice, **but props and target stands may NOT be moved or shot at.**
- Except for the **Plate Racks**, you may **NOT** shoot at any **Club steel.**

Bay Use, Boundaries & Safety Requirements

- **No vehicles may be parked inside a bay** while any shooting is taking place.
- **No shooting is allowed from outside the bay.**
- The **limits of a bay** are defined as the fence line or the **downrange edge of the covered area.**
- **Shelters are outside the bay** and are **not** shooting positions.
- **All shots fired must directly impact a berm** — no skipping rounds, no questionable angles.
- **NO MUZZLES OVER THE BERMS — EVER.** This is a zero-tolerance safety rule.

Bay Use, Boundaries & Safety Requirements

- **Cleanup requirements**
 - Pick up all empty cartridge cases and shotgun shells; place them in the trash cans.
 - **Clean your bay** before leaving.
 - Remove all used targets before you go.
- **Event setup rules**
 - Bays set up for events may be used for practice, **but props and target stands may NOT be moved or shot at.**
 - **Club steel may NOT be shot,** except for the **Plate Racks.**

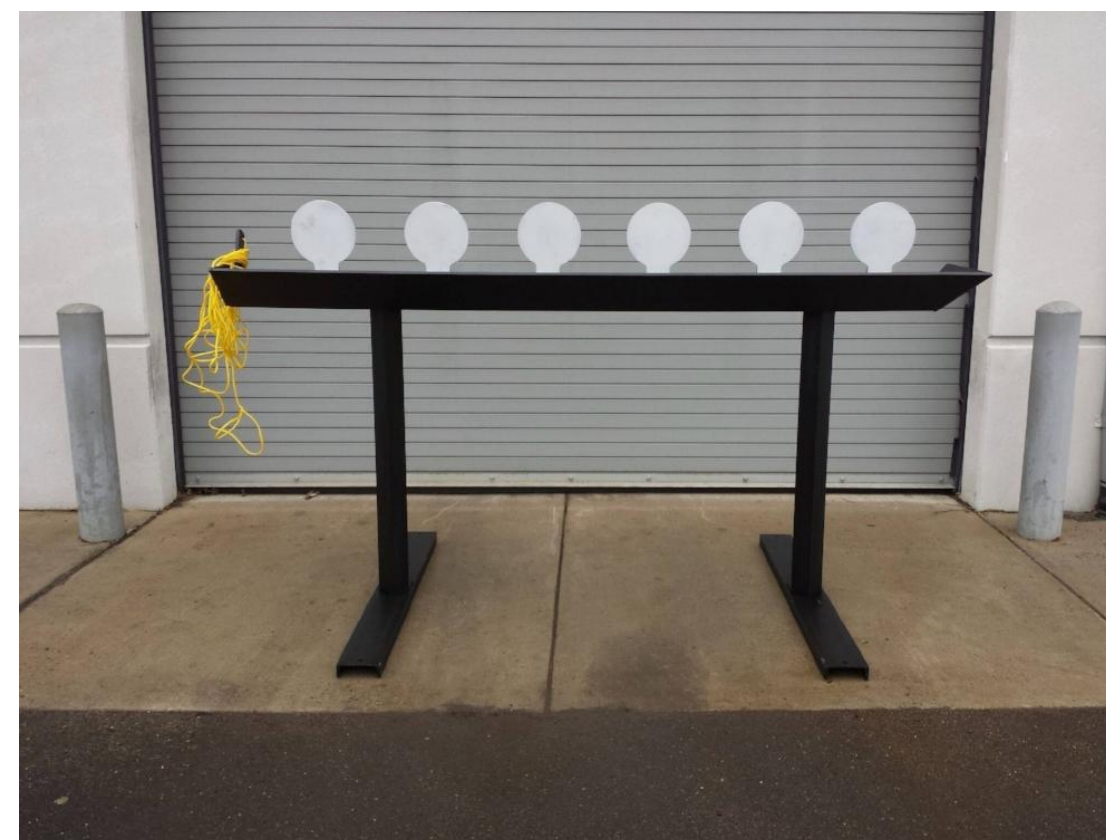
Use of Concealed Carry

- Club Members certified in the Action Area are allowed to arrive at the club with a loaded, concealed weapon intended for use in the Action Area.
- The loaded **Concealed** firearm **CAN NOT** be handled outside an Action Area bay!
- The loaded **Concealed** firearm can **only be handled** inside an Action Area bay!
- To use the concealed weapon in the Action Area, they must follow all Action Area rules concerning holstering and the 180-degree rule.
- This is for use in the Action Area Only.
- They may subsequently depart with a loaded, concealed weapon.
- This waiver does not extend to **guests!**

Targets



- Only paper/cardboard, clays or steel targets are allowed in the Action bays.
- (new) Self-healing targets are treated as cardboard targets.
- Clays can be used with a holder or placed on the berm.
- Targets should be placed so all shots, hitting or missing the target, must impact the berm.
- No explosive targets or ammunition are allowed.



Targets



- **Targets other than paper/cardboard, steel or clays must be approved by the pistol director.**
- **No shooting at ground targets is allowed.**
 - **A ground target is any target so low that a miss will result in the bullet impacting the floor of the bay.**

Target Placement



Correct – shots will impact berm



Incorrect – shots will not impact berm



Incorrect – single stick will destroy sticks

Target Placement



Targets should be placed so all shots, hitting or missing the target, must impact the berm.

Shooting Steel



- **The Plate Racks are the only club steel that can be used for general use.**
- The shooter must be at least 10 yards away.
- Shooter must wear proper safety gear.
- Cannot be shot at more than a 15-degree angle from front.
- Steel must be positioned so any ricochet will impact the side berms and not back toward the road.
- Steel targets must be placed near the berm so that ALL missed shots will impact the berm and not the floor of the bay.

ONLY pistol-caliber cartridges, 7 ½ to 9 birdshot and .22 rimfire allowed on steel.

Steel set up for matches is OFF LIMITS and may not be shot.

Do Not Double-Tap the Plate Racks or any falling steel targets!

Shooting Steel

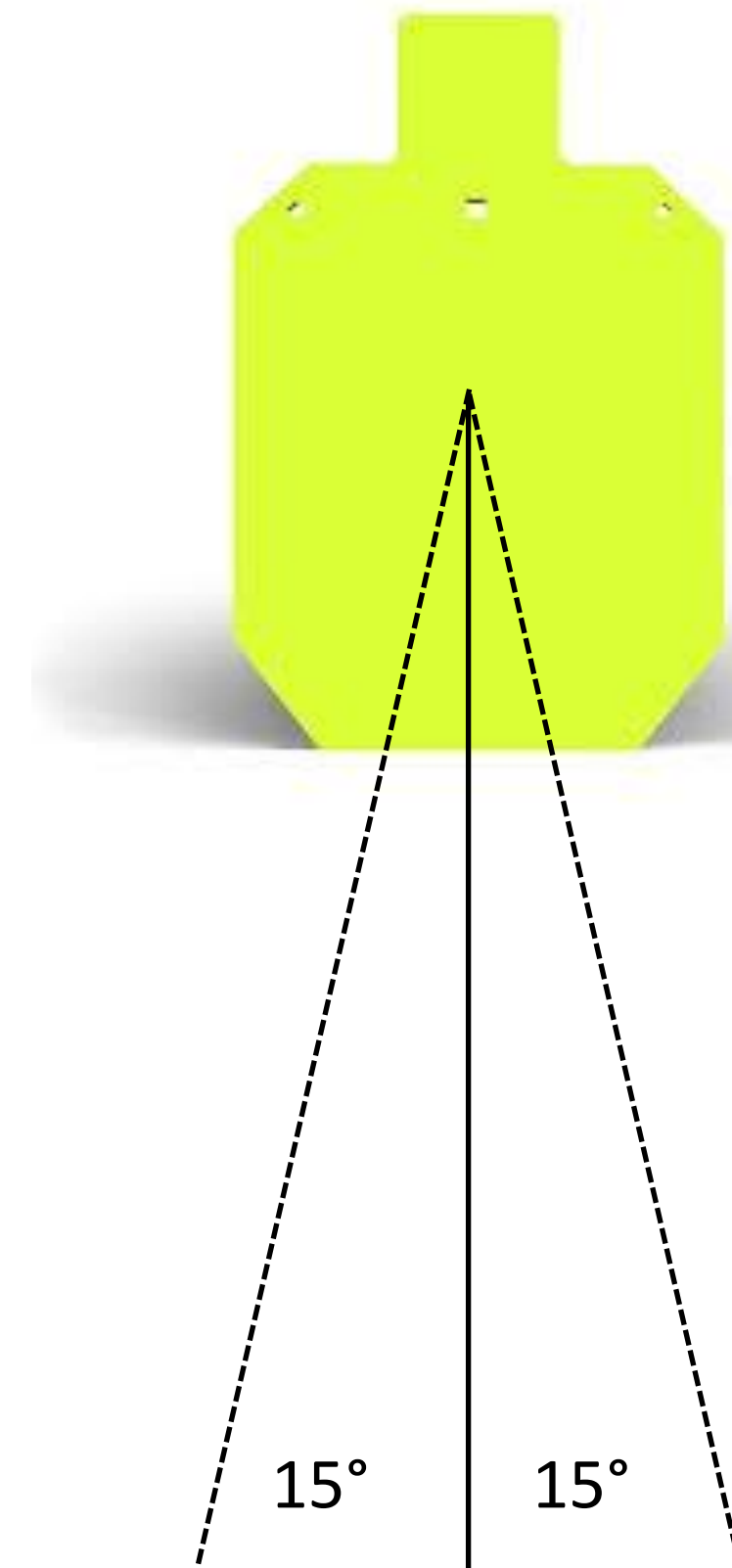


- **NO rifle-caliber cartridges on steel (5.56, .223, 5.7, .308, 7.62x39, etc.)**
- **A single centerfire rifle cartridge on a steel plate can wreck the plate.**
- **Divots in the plate can cause unpredictable ricochet**

Personal Steel



- Personal steel must be approved by the pistol director (email pistol@pmrpc.com).
- Material should be AR500 or AR550 steel.
- Steel targets in the Action Area may only be used with pistol caliber ammunition only – no rifles.
- Target stands should hold steel at an angle, so any ricochet is directed down to the ground.
- Target stands should be tall enough so all missed shots will impact the berm.
- Targets should be hanging style and not falling steel or self-resetting (poppers).

The RIGHT Gear....

- **helps insure safe gun handling**

Safety Gear

- Eye Protection is required at all times inside the Action Area Gate.
- Ear Protection required when shooting and recommended when under the shelters.
- Hat is recommended while in the Action Area.
 - **Protects your eyes from falling shot from skeet.**
 - Protects your eyes from ejected brass and splatter from steel.
 - Cuts down glare.
 - Prevents sweat from dripping into eyes.

Eye Protection is ALWAYS required in the Action Area



Acceptable Holsters

- **Strong-side (no cross draw)**
- **Rigid mouth (holds holster open for one-handed reholstering)**

Leather



Kydex



- **Trigger covered**

Unacceptable Holsters

- No Bra Holsters
- No Shoulder Holsters
- No Small-of-Back (SOB) Holsters
- No behind the hip holsters
- No holsters with flabby mouths



Check before Reholstering

- **Clothing or debris in your holster can cause a really bad day.**



Don't Be THAT Guy

Black Powder / Muzzleloaders

- **no smoking allowed within 10 feet of black powder/ powder pellets.**
- **powder can only be loaded from a separate measure.**
- **pistol loading must use stand to hold firearm vertical.**
- **no open powder or pellet containers allowed at shooting tables.**
- **clean up shooting tables of all spilled powder immediately. Powder spilled on the ground must be well scattered.**

Automatic Weapons

- Use of automatic weapons requires at least two people to be present. **One of them must be a PMRPC-approved NFA range officer.**
- All select-fire guns must be chambered for pistol rounds. **No select-fire guns chambered for rifle cartridges may be fired without board approval.**
- It is illegal to own bumpfire stocks or similar devices designed to accelerate the rate of fire of a semiauto.
 - Florida is one of 15 States with a specific ban still in effect.
 - Florida ban includes Forced Reset Triggers.

Slung Rifle

- Engage safety before slinging
- **Keep at least one hand on the gun when it is hot (loaded)**
 - **Never dangle a hot (loaded) gun**
- Start empty, end empty (load immediately before use)
- Always face the berm when gun is hot (loaded)
- **MUZZLE CONTROL!!!!**
 - Make sure it's slung vertical, not horizontal
 - Keep muzzle from pointing behind you

Reminders

- All shooting must be from inside the fence area.
- Mini-Bays -- be conscientious to stay inside, and aware of what others are doing.
