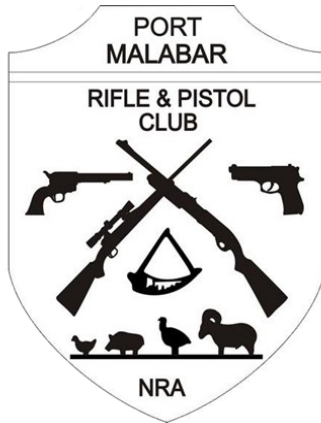

PMRPC Purpose

PMRPC Meetings

BOARD MEETINGS

are held once a month, and more often when needed. The Board of Directors meet to review and act on club business. Public comments and questions from the membership are welcome at these meetings, but only the Board votes on business matters. Board meetings are held at 7 p.m. on the second Wednesday of each month at PMRPC.

MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

are held four times a year -- three regular membership meetings and the Annual Meeting. The president presides over membership meetings, but it is the membership itself that makes motions and votes. Generally, the membership meetings are held in April, July and October and the Annual Meeting is held in January. Please see PMRPC calendar for more details. Agendas can be found on the PMRPC.com website. A quorum of 2% of members eligible to vote is required for a vote.



RSO MEETINGS

PMRPC has a Range Safety Officers Committee staffed by experienced volunteers from almost every discipline and activity at the club. RSOs are trained and certified NRA

Range Safety Officers. The RSO Committee reviews violations of safety rules and reviews the rules and procedures for all ranges.

PMRPC Meetings

The RSO Committee meets the **First Wednesday** of every month at 7:00 PM. All Safety-minded members are invited to attend. Prospective members, who have been PMRPC members for at least one year, can become RSO Committee members after attending three meetings, successfully completing a test on PMRPC range rules and RSO procedures & conduct, and subject to a vote of approval by a simple majority of the members present. After completing a six-month probationary term by actively performing the duties of an RSO, they will become full members.

PMRPC IS A

chartered under IRS rule 501(c)4 to promote the Second Amendment and give residents the opportunity to exercise their right to keep and bear arms and to develop advanced marksmanship and safe gun handling. 7. **EMAIL OFFICIALS** – **911@pmrpc.com** (this will text 3 officials)

8. **CALL A RANGE OFFICIAL EMERGENCY PHONE 321-884-2672**

9. **DON'T DISTURB THE SCENE.**

10. **DO Gather photos, witness statements and member numbers**

Only allow emergency personnel to enter property – no media.

No statements should be given except to police.

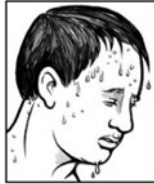

- ◆ HIGH BODY TEMPERATURE (103 +)
- ◆ HOT, RED, DRY, OR DAMP SKIN
- ◆ FAST, STRONG PULSE.
- ◆ HEADACHE
- ◆ DIZZINESS
- ◆ NAUSEA
- ◆ CONFUSION
- ◆ LOSS OF CONSCIOUSNESS (PASSING OUT.)



WHAT TO DO:

- ◆ CALL 911 RIGHT AWAY- HEAT STROKE IS A MEDICAL EMERGENCY
- ◆ MOVE THE PERSON TO A COOLER PLACE
- ◆ HELP LOWER THE PERSON'S TEMPERATURE WITH COOL CLOTHS
- ◆ DO NOT GIVE THE PERSON ANYTHING TO DRINK

MEANING IT IS EVERY MEMBER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT EVERYONE IS PRACTICING SAFE GUN HANDLING. IF YOU SEE AN UNSAFE CONDITION OR YOU ARE CONCERNED WITH SOMEONE'S BEHAVIOR:

IF YOU ARE IN DANGER, LEAVE THE AREA AND CALL 911.

IF SOMEONE'S BEHAVIOR ENDANGERS THEMSELVES OR OTHERS, CALL "CEASE FIRE."

IN A CALM AND RATIONAL MANNER, EXPLAIN THE SAFETY CONCERN AND THE CLUB/RANGE RULES. MOST OF THE TIME, THEY WILL COMPLY.

IF YOU ARE UNCOMFORTABLE TALKING TO THE MEMBER, FIND AN RSO, CLUB OFFICIAL OR CALL **321-956-8300** (SENDS TEXT)

EMERGENCY PHONE 321-844-2762

BE COURTEOUS.

DO NOT BECOME CONFRONTATIONAL WITH THE MEMBER.

IF MEMBER BECOMES CONFRONTATIONAL: BACK AWAY AND GET AS MUCH INFORMATION AS YOU CAN.

RECORD DATE/TIME/LOCATION AND MEMBER NAME IF POSSIBLE.

GET A PICTURE OF THEIR VEHICLE AND LICENSE PLATE.

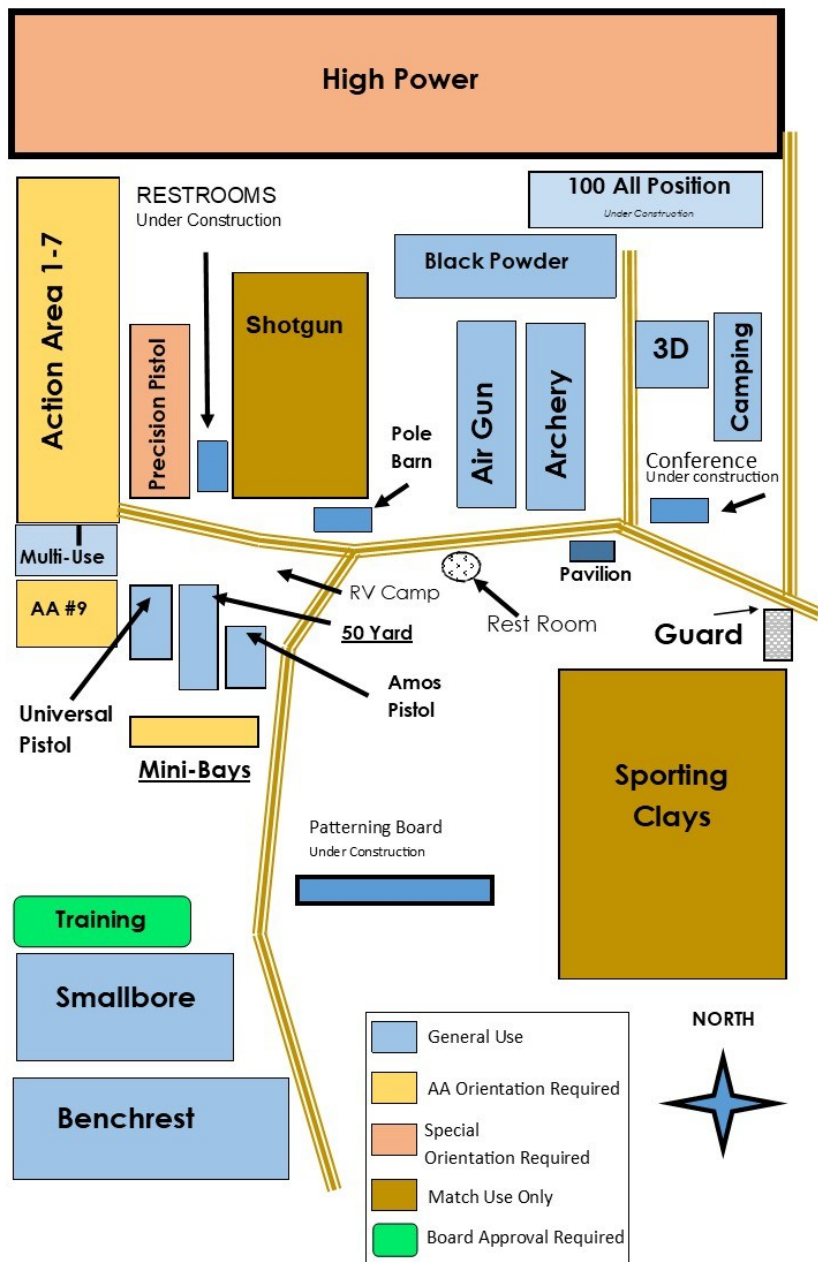

Range Map



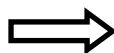
General Range Rules



WHEN APPROACHING ANY RANGE ALWAYS READ THE RULE BOARD FOR RANGE-SPECIFIC RULES, GUNS & AMMO.



ALL GUESTS MUST BE REGISTERED USING HOLD HARMLESS FORM WHEN ENTERING RANGE.



NOTE: Club Insurance Company REQUIRES that all persons on the property must wear closed toed shoes and shooters MUST use eye protection and NO shooter may wear low cut tops.

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION.

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL READY TO SHOOT.

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE.

MEMBERS MUST READ AND UNDERSTAND PMRPC'S "TERMS AND DEFINITIONS" BEFORE USING FIRING RANGES.

SHOOTING IS ALLOWED ON DESIGNATED, OPEN RANGES DAILY FROM 8 AM TO SUNSET.

SCHEDULED SHOOTING ACTIVITIES TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER CASUAL USE OF RANGES.

MEMBERS MUST CLEARLY DISPLAY THEIR OWN MEMBERSHIP BADGE WHILE ON PMRPC PROPERTY, EXCEPT WHEN PARTICIPATING IN A WORK PARTY.

MEMBERS MUST PRESENT THEIR MEMBERSHIP BADGE UPON REQUEST BY A CLUB OFFICIAL OR ANOTHER MEMBER.

CLUB-OWNED VEHICLES CAN ONLY BE OPERATED BY AUTHORIZED CLUB MEMBERS OR CONTRACTORS.

NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE CONSUMED ON ANY RANGE. NO ONE MAY HANDLE OR DISCHARGE ANY FIRE-ARM ON CLUB PROPERTY AFTER CONSUMING ALCOHOL.

NO RECREATIONAL DRUGS ALLOWED ON CLUB PROPERTY.

MEMBERS- GUESTS ARE LIMITED TO A MAXIMUM OF 3 GUESTS PER VISIT TO THE RANGE, GUESTS MUST REMAIN WITH THEIR HOST, HOST IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL GUESTS' ACTIONS.

General Range Rules

GUEST REGISTRATION– USING **HOLD HARMLESS FORM** IS REQUIRED FOR EVERY GUEST WHEN ENTERING THE CLUB. AVAILABLE AT WEB SITE OR IN PAPER FORM AT GATE HOUSE. IT IS GOOD FOR 1 YEAR.

MEMBERS-GUEST MUST BE WITHIN ARM'S LENGTH DISTANCE FROM ANY GUEST WHEN THE GUEST IS SHOOTING IN ORDER TO STOP DANGEROUS ACTIONS.

MEMBERS-GUEST MUST NOT SHOOT WHILE THEIR GUEST IS SHOOTING. ONLY 1 MEMBER OF THE PARTY MAY SHOOT AT A TIME.

A NON-FAMILY GUEST IS LIMITED TO 4 VISITS A YEAR.

ALL CONCEALED FIREARMS MUST REMAIN CONCEALED.

FIREARMS TO BE SHOT ON PROPERTY MUST ARRIVE UNLOADED AND IN SAFE CONDITION.

ORGANIZERS OF ANY CLUB EVENT MAY PROHIBIT CONCEALED CARRY DURING THAT EVENT.

ONLY DELIBERATE, AIMED FIRE IS ALLOWED, EXCEPT IN ACTION AREA -- POINT SHOOTING ALLOWED.

NO GROUND TARGETS. ONLY PAPER TARGETS AFFIXED TO OFFICIALLY APPROVED TARGET BACKERS.

SHOOTERS MUST REMOVE USED TARGETS FROM BACKERS BEFORE LEAVING THE FIRING RANGE.

MUST PICK UP EMPTY CARTRIDGE CASINGS/SHOTSHELL HULLS AND PLACE TRASH IN TRASH CANS. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERY MEMBER TO KEEP THE FACILITIES AND RANGES CLEAN. CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR VISITING PETS.

UNFIRED AMMO - LIVE OR MISFIRED - MUST BE DISPOSED OF IN LIVE--AMMO CANS, NOT TRASH CONTAINERS.

RULES MAY CHANGE DURING SCHEDULED EVENTS WITH RANGE OFFICER PRESENT.

ALL MEMBERS MUST ENTER AND EXIT THE PROPERTY THROUGH THE ELECTRONIC GATE, EVEN IF GUARDED GATE IS OPEN.

MEMBERS MUST NOT "TAILGATE" OTHER MEMBERS THROUGH THE ELECTRONIC GATE.

MEMBERS MAY ALLOW THEIR **GUESTS** TO "TAILGATE" THE MEMBER THROUGH THE ELECTRONIC GATE.

EXECUTIVE BOARD APPROVAL IS REQUIRED FOR ORGANIZING MATCHES, ACTIVITIES OR COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES.

CARTRIDGES DESIGNED TO EXPEL A BURNING PAYLOAD OR EXPLOSIVE PROJECTILE ARE PROHIBITED.

RED Line Range

Red line applies to:

**Bench Rest
Small Bore
50 Yard
Universal Pistol
Multi-use
Air Gun / Archery
100 Yard
All Position**

The **RED LINE** policy is to ensure that while the **Range** is **COLD**, no person will handle a firearm and that no person will discharge a firearm while targets are being changed.

Shooters must verify Range Condition before moving any uncased firearms.

ALL shooting must be from the firing line **ONLY**.

Changing the range status must be by **UNANAMOUS** consent of all shooters.

BLACK FLAG = USE RESTRICTED

IT IS UNSAFE TO SHOOT IN THE AREA.

There may be workers on the range, a special event may place members in an unsafe position, in the line of fire or other hazards.

Most commonly used at Sporting Clays Stations 1-2.

RED FLAG / GREEN FLAG

Each range listed has both **RED** and **GREEN** flags which control the movement of shooters. Unanimous consent of all shooters is required to change the flags.

The **USE** of Range Flags is **required** at all times the Range is in use.

RED flags are rectangles and **GREEN** flags are triangles.

RED FLAG = HOT RANGE

SHOOTERS MAY NOT:

Move forward of the firing line for any reason.

If something is dropped forward of the line the shooter **MUST** wait until a cold range is called and the Flags have been changed.

SHOOTERS MAY:

Move Firearms to and from shooting benches in **SAFE** Condition, (Cased or Unloaded, Muzzle Down **only**).

FIRE, Load, Unload and handle Firearms while muzzle is pointed downrange and at a berm (the use of bipods which raise the muzzle over the berm must use a butt support insuring the muzzle is not pointed over the berm).

GREEN Flag = COLD Range

ALL Firearms MUST have been made safe with either chamber flag or encased BEFORE the range has been called COLD.

SHOOTERS MAY NOT:

STEP forward of the RED LINE.

Move ANYTHING to or from the SHOOTING bench.

SHOOTERS MAY:

Remove eye/ear protection
Move Forward of the firing line to Check/Hang/Replace targets.

Recover items or brass which is forward of the firing line.

Move safely encased firearms to and from Vehicles to SEATING benches (NOT to firing line).



PMRPC Terms and Definitions

180-DEGREE RULE —

ACTION AREA WITH THE SHOOTER DIRECTLY FACING THE IMPACT BERM, THE SHOOTER CAN FIRE AT ANY TARGET WITHIN A 180-DEGREE ARC.



AT NO TIME CAN THE MUZZLE OF THE FIREARM BREAK THE 180-DEGREE ARC AND POINT UPRANGE. IF THE MUZZLE IS POINTED STRAIGHT DOWN, IT IS NOT VIOLATING THE 180-DEGREE RULE.

AIRGUN — A GUN THAT USES COMPRESSED GAS TO PROPEL A PROJECTILE. EXAMPLES: BB GUN, PELLET GUN, CO2 GUN. THESE ARE TO BE INCLUDED WHEN REFERRING TO "FIREARMS" WITHIN ALL RULES AND SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS.

ARCHERY — THE SHOOTING OF ARROWS OR BOLTS FROM A BOW OR CROSSBOW. BOWS ARE CONSIDERED "FIREARMS" FOR SAFETY DISCUSSIONS. ARROWS AND BOLTS CONSIDERED AS AMMUNITION.

ARM BRACE — DEVICE ON AN EXTENSION TUBE OF AN AR-15 OR SIMILAR FIREARM THAT ATTACHES TO THE SHOOTER'S FOREARM TO STABILIZE THE FIREARM.

BACKSTOP — A BARRIER DESIGNED TO SAFELY STOP BULLETS AND SIMILAR PROJECTILES FIRED ON A RANGE.

BAFFLE – A BARRIER TO CONSTRAIN THE PATH OF BULLETS FIRED ON A RANGE.

BENCHREST POSITION – FIRING FROM A HORIZONTALLY SUPPORTED POSITION AT A SHOOTING BENCH.

BERM – AN EARTHEN MOUND USED AS A BACKSTOP ON A RANGE.

BLACK POWDER – AN EXPLOSIVE MIXTURE USED IN FIREARMS AS A PROPELLANT.

BIPOD – A TWO-LEGGED SUPPORT FOR THE FRONT END OF A RIFLE. MUST BE USED WITH A **BUTT REST** TO ENSURE THE RIFLE IS KEPT HORIZONTAL.

BUCKSHOT – LARGE SHOTGUN PELLETS USED FOR HUNTING OR FOR SELF DEFENSE.

BULLET TRAP – DEVICE DESIGNED TO TRAP/ CAPTURE BULLETS.

CARBINE – A RIFLE WITH A RELATIVELY SHORT BARREL, BUT NOT SHORTER THAN 16 INCHES.

CASUAL SHOOTING – ANY SHOOTING ACTIVITY OTHER THAN A SCHEDULED MATCH OR PRACTICE.

CENTERFIRE – A CARTRIDGE WITH A REMOVABLE PRIMER IN THE CENTER OF THE CASE HEAD.

CEASE FIRE – COMMAND USED WHENEVER ALL SHOOTING MUST IMMEDIATELY STOP. ANYONE MAY CALL “CEASE FIRE.” IMMEDIATELY STOP SHOOTING, MAINTAIN MUZZLE AND TRIGGER DISCIPLINE, AND DETERMINE WHY “CEASE FIRE” WAS CALLED.

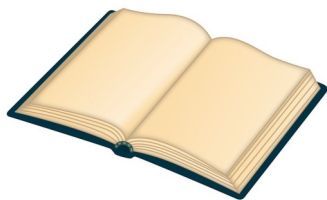
COLD – THE CONDITION ON THE RANGE IN WHICH ALL FIREARMS MUST BE MADE SAFE OR SAFELY ENCASED. THE GREEN FLAG MUST BE DISPLAYED. HANDLING FIREARMS IS PROHIBITED.

CONCEALED – HIDDEN FROM VIEW

DOWNRANGE – THE SECTION OF A FIRING RANGE BETWEEN THE FIRING LINE AND THE BACKSTOP.

EYEBROW – A TYPE OF DOWNRANGE BAFFLE.

FIREARM – BY FEDERAL LAW, A GUN THAT USES A CHEMICAL PROPELLANT TO FIRE A PROJECTILE. TO ENSURE SAFE PRACTICES AND HABITS, PMRPC RULES TREAT AIRGUNS, BOWS AND CROSSBOWS AS FIREARMS.



FIRING LINE – THE LINE FROM WHICH GUNFIRE IS DIRECTED AT TARGETS. A LINE PARALLEL TO THE TARGET LINE, FROM BEHIND WHICH, FIREARMS ARE DISCHARGED.

FIRING RANGE – A FACILITY FOR SAFELY SHOOTING FIREARMS, AIR GUNS OR BOWS. BEGINS 20 FEET FROM BEHIND THE DESIGNATED FIRING LINE AND CONTINUES TO THE BERM OR IMPACT AREA.

FLAG-RANGE -THE RED FLAG AT THE ENTRANCE TO EACH RANGE INDICATING THAT THE RANGE IS IN USE.

HOT – FOR A FIREARM: ANY CONDITION OTHER THAN SAFE OR SAFELY ENCASED. FOR A RANGE: THE CONDITION WHEN SHOOTING IS ALLOWED. THE RED FLAG MUST BE DISPLAYED. NO ONE MAY MOVE FORWARD OF THE FIRING LINE.



HORIZONTAL REST – (SHOOTING REST) A DEVICE FOR HOLDING A FIREARM HORIZONTAL AND STEADY WHILE SHOOTING. CAN BE A SANDBAG, TRIPOD OR "SLED" TYPE DEVICE. A BENCH REST.

INCENDIARY AMMO – TRACERS, FLARES, HEI'S, FIRESTORMS, RUFIOUS ROUNDS, DRAGON'S BREATH SHOTGUNS SHELLS, OR ANY CARTRIDGE DESIGNED TO EXPEL A BURNING PAYLOAD OR EXPLOSIVE PROJECTILE.

MAGNUM – A TERM INDICATING A METALLIC CARTRIDGE OR SHOT SHELL LOADED TO HIGHER PRESSURE THAN STANDARD CARTRIDGES.

MALFUNCTION – A FAILURE TO FIRE, EXTRACT, SQUIB, ETC.

MUZZLE DISCIPLINE – THE HABITS OF ENSURING THAT YOUR MUZZLE ALWAYS POINTS IN A SAFE DIRECTION. THE SAFE DIRECTION AT PMRPC IS DIRECTLY AT A BERM OR STRAIGHT DOWN.

MUZZLELOADER – TYPE OF FIREARM IN WHICH POWDER AND PROJECTILES ARE SEPARATELY LOADED THROUGH THE MUZZLE.

NFA (NATIONAL FIREARMS ACT OF 1934) – THE SET OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS THAT GOVERN THE SALE AND POSSESSION OF CERTAIN RESTRICTED CLASSES OF FIREARMS.

PISTOL – HANDGUN CAPABLE OF BEING SHOT WHILE HELD AND SUPPORTED WITH ONE HAND. PISTOLS HAVE CHAMBER INTEGRAL WITH BARREL.

PISTOL-CALIBER CARBINE – A CARBINE THAT FIRES PISTOL CALIBER AMMO.

RANGE SAFETY OFFICER – A TRAINED, DESIGNATED RANGE OFFICIAL WHO EDUCATES SHOOTERS, ENFORCES THE RANGE RULES AND ENSURES SAFE CONDITIONS.

REVOLVER – HANDGUN; AMMO HELD IN A CYLINDER OF CHAMBERS.

RIFLE-CALIBER PISTOL – A PISTOL DESIGNED TO FIRE RIFLE-CALIBER CARTRIDGES, COMMONLY BOTTLE NECK DESIGNED CARTRIDGES.

RIMFIRE – A RIMMED CARTRIDGE WITH THE PRIMER INSIDE THE CRUSHABLE RIM.

SAFE CONDITION – THE CONDITION IN WHICH A FIREARM CANNOT FIRE: FIREARM IS UNLOADED, MAGAZINE REMOVED IF POSSIBLE, SLIDE LOCKED TO THE REAR, OR CYLINDER/ACTION OPEN AND CHAMBER FLAG INSTALLED.

SAFE DIRECTION – THE DIRECTION IN WHICH A FIREARM WOULD DO THE LEAST DAMAGE IF DISCHARGED. WHEN A BERM OR TRAP IS PRESENT, FIREARMS MUST BE HANDLED SO THAT THE MUZZLE IS POINTING DIRECTLY AT THE BERM OR TRAP, AND BULLETS WILL IMPACT DIRECTLY INTO IT. IF A MUZZLE IS NOT POINTED DOWNRANGE, IT MUST BE POINTED AT THE GROUND.

SAFELY ENCASED – FIREARM IS IN A HOLSTER OR CASE THAT PROTECTS THE TRIGGER.

SHOTFALL FIELD – AN AREA USED TO SAFELY ACCEPT FALLING SHOT DOWN RANGE OF SHOTGUN SHOOTING.

SHOULDER – TO FIRMLY SEAT THE STOCK OF A RIFLE OR SHOTGUN IN THE SHOULDER POCKET.

SIGHT LINE – AN UNOBSTRUCTED LINE OF SIGHT BETWEEN AN OBSERVER AND THE SUBJECT OF INTEREST.

SIMULATED AUTOMATIC FIRE – USING A MECHANICAL DEVICE TO FIRE A GUN MORE RAPIDLY THAN NORMALLY POSSIBLE. SUCH DEVICES ARE PROHIBITED IN FLORIDA.

SLUG – A SINGLE, CYLINDRICAL PROJECTILE DESIGNED TO BE FIRED FROM A SHOTGUN.

STOPPAGE—FIREARM FAILURE TO FEED, EJECT OR GO INTO BATTERY

TARGET LINE – A LINE DOWNRANGE PARALLEL TO THE FIRING LINE ALONG WHICH TARGETS ARE PLACED.

VELOCITY- THE SPEED AT WHICH A PROJECTILE TRAVELS (USUALLY MEASURED AND REPORTED IN FEET OR METERS PER SECOND).

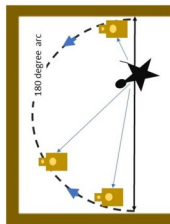

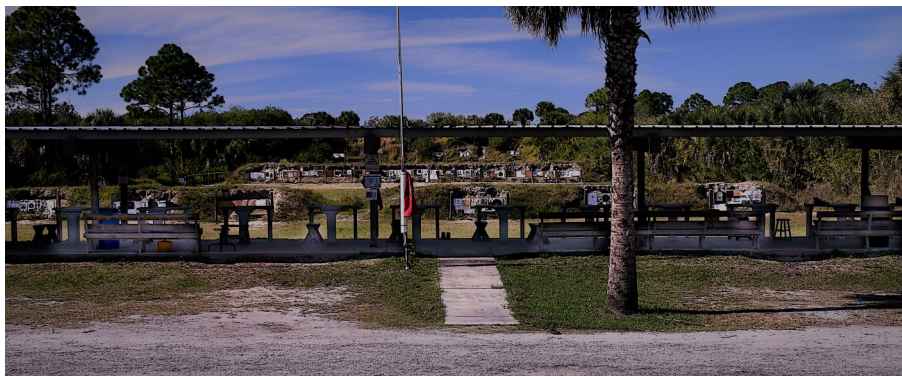

Members may bring up to 3 guests to a scheduled event who will shoot with a squad.

Casual Clays

Members may set up their own clay throwers – hand, spring loaded or automatic systems.

Members may not use the installed automatic systems at any of the locations.

Shooting permitted in 2 areas: Skeet & Trap fields to the North, Sporting Clays stations 1 & 2 to South.

Permitted only outside of scheduled events

When shooting between Sporting Clays stations 1 & 2, ensure the **Red Flag** at the Clays meeting table is **down**.

Never shoot when the **BLACK Flag** is up.

Shooting on other stations of Sporting Clays is **not** allowed.

Ensure that shot does not land on south road.

Shot size 7 ½ - 9 only; **Limited to 2 shells loaded at a time.**

Any member may participate with a suitable shotgun – over/under, automatic, pump or tactical in 12, 16, 20, 28 gauge or .410 bore.

NO Handguns,

Skeet

Practice and formal competitions on regulation fields. Clay throwers inside skeet houses are used only during scheduled events and must be operated by authorized personnel.

Shoots are held multiple times per week.

See PMRPC web calendar for times.

Any member may participate with a suitable shotgun – over/under, automatic, pump or tactical in 12, 20, 28 gauge or .410 bore.

NO Handguns, firing any kind of shot, is ever allowed.

Shot Size 7 ½ - 9 only; Limited to 2 shells loaded at a time

Experienced Skeet shooters are welcome to join a squad.

Beginners are welcome and will be shown the ropes by the RO or another experienced Skeet shooter.

The club schedules NSSA sanctioned matches periodically.

Trap

Practice on regulation trap fields. Clay throwers inside trap houses are used only during scheduled events and must be operated by authorized personnel.

5 Trap fields & houses with throwers; usually matches use fields 2-4 only. Fields set with automatic pull system using microphones.

Fields may be used for "trap-like" events by casual shooters with their own throwers outside of scheduled events.

Shoots are held Thursday and Sunday 9 am until last squad is finished.

Any member may participate with a suitable shotgun – over/under, automatic, pump or tactical in 12, 16, 20, 28 gauge or .410 bore.

NO Handguns, firing any kind of shot, is ever allowed.

Shot size 7 ½ - 9 only; Limited to 2 shells loaded at a time

Trap can include 4 separate events – Standard, Handi-capped, Wobble or Doubles.

Experienced Trap shooters are welcome to join a squad.

Beginners are welcome and will be shown the ropes by the RO or another experienced Trap shooter.

5 Stand

An abbreviated version of Sporting Clays. Shot over the 3rd Skeet field using Hi and Low Houses plus 8-10 more traps scattered to present various bird flights.

Traps used only when scheduled and by trained Range Officers.

Any member may participate with a suitable shotgun – over/under, semi-automatic, pump or tactical in 12, 16, 20, 28 gauge or .410 bore.

NO Handguns, firing any kind of shot, is ever allowed.

Shot size 7 ½ - 9 only; up to 2 shells loaded at a time.

Experienced shooters are welcome to join a squad.

Beginners are welcome to join a group and will be shown the ropes by the Chair or a RO.

Shoots are held Wednesday evenings and Saturday mornings and continue until no shooters are left to squad.

Sporting Clays

A map of the sporting clay course is on the last page of this handbook

An event shot in a natural setting of 30+ acres of woodland. There are fourteen stations with 3 traps simulating hunting situations, in a wide variety of presentations.



Ground and elevated shooting positions with electric pull cords led to traps. The Sporting Clay stations (except 1&2) can only be used during scheduled events.

For personal use of stations 1&2 you must bring your own thrower outside of scheduled events.

Any member may participate with a suitable shotgun – over/under, automatic, pump or tactical in 12, 16, 20, 28 gauge or .410 bore.

Handicapped accessible with alternative shooting positions in some cases.

NO Handguns, firing any kind of shot, is ever allowed.

F A Q

What are the hours of operation? How early/late can I shoot?

Shooting is allowed on designated, open ranges daily from 8 am until Sun Set (daily time available on-line).

What gate do I use to enter the range?

When you enter and exit the property, you must use the electronic gate with your key card.
That logs you in and out.

How do I enter/exit when the electronic gate is not functioning for an extended period of time?

A club official will put a special lock on the manual gate that your issued mechanical key will unlock.

How do I exit the range if the electronic gate malfunctions?

There is a small box on the west side of the gate house that contains a key to a padlock on the manual gate. Use the key to open the lock, **replace the key**, open the manual gate, drive through, close the manual gate and replace and relock the padlock. Notify range official of gate malfunction. You may not be able to enter during this time.

How can I find out about upcoming events and training opportunities?

On **www.pmrpc.com/calendar**, the PMRPC newsletter, and the PMRPC Facebook page. For information on classes, contact **safetyofficer@pmrpc.com**.

What do I do if I am not receiving the monthly newsletter?

Contact the club secretary at **secretary@pmrpc.com**.

How do I log into the member side of the website?

There is a link on the lower right-hand side of the website.
Click and follow the instructions.

Is the range pet friendly?

Yes, the range is pet friendly. They are **your** responsibility while on the range. The ponds often have alligators.

What do I do if I find someone else's property at a firing range?

Contact the Executive officer at **exec@pmrpc.com**. Do not take your find home, a board member will get it.

Why do I have to keep an active NRA Membership?

PMRPC is a 100% NRA-affiliated club.

Where can I go to get more involved with the range?

You can contact any Board member or go to the Board Meeting on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. You can also contact an RSO or attend the RSO Committee meeting on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Stay up to date with events using the calendar on the **PMRPC.com** website.

Are there first aid kits available on the range?

Basic first aid kits are available at each range. In addition, **AEDS/Trauma kits** are available in the **Pole Barn, Action Area** block building, **Stat Shack** in High Power, 200 yd **Benchrest** and **Training** Building.

How old does my child have to be to shoot at PMRPC?

You are the ultimate authority on your child's maturity and ability to handle guns responsibly.

How many guests can I bring to the range?

You can bring 3 guests at a time to PMRPC. No individual guest can be brought to PMRPC more than 4 times a year. All guests must fill out the **Hold Harmless form**.

See page 14-15 BEFORE YOU BRING GUESTS TO THE RANGE.

Can my guests drive their own vehicle on to the range, or do they have to ride in mine?

Your guest can drive their own vehicle, but they must stay with you and enter and exit the range when you do.

Can I camp at the range?

Email **Exec@pmrpc.com** to make arrangements.

What do I do if I see someone being unsafe?

You should call 'Cease Fire' and go talk to the shooter. Get their name, license plate number and submit a report to an RSO or the range safety officer. If you are uncomfortable talking to the member, find an RSO. See page 6&12.

Who can I contact if I have a question on a range procedure?

Contact the RSO chair at **RSOChair@pmrpc.com**.

What do I do if I find something damaged or broken?

Contact the executive officer at **exec@pmrpc.com**

How do I determine the range for shooting a specific firearm or caliber?

Where can I shoot a pistol-caliber carbine?

Consult **ALLOWED FIREARMS** Insert or Check the rules board posted at each range.

Action Area, Mini-Bays, 50 Yard Practice, Multi-Use, Universal Pistol and 200 Yard Bench Rest.

Where can I pattern my shotgun?

Refer to page 37 for details. Multi-Use range allows Hunting loads, buck or slugs at Paper target on 50 yard Backer.

Are fully automatic firearms allowed to be fired at PMRPC?

Subguns must be fired in the Action Areas ONLY, under the supervision of an NFA RO. If the shooter is an NFA RO, there must be another person present while shooting.

Rifle-caliber machine guns require special permission.

Are suppressor and other NFA devices allowed to be fired at PMRPC?

Suppressed firearms are allowed on all ranges. SBRs are allowed wherever rifles can be fired. Shooter must have legal documentation on their person.

Can I fire my bump stock or binary trigger at PMRPC?

NO. Devices that simulate automatic fire are prohibited as per Federal and Florida law.

Where can I shoot my Rifle-Caliber Pistol?

Consult **ALLOWED FIREARMS** Insert or Check the rules board posted at each range.

The Action Area, 50 Yard, Multi-Use 50 yard allowed.

Allowed on the 200 Yard Benchrest only with Arm Brace when supported in **TWO Places**.

What do I do with a misfired cartridge?

WAIT 30 seconds before opening chamber, then dispose of round in red can marked "Live Ammo" on each range.

What do I do if I have a firearm malfunction while shooting?

If you know how to clear the malfunction, do so. If not, find an RSO or another knowledgeable club member to help you. Remember to keep your muzzle pointed in a safe direction.

Does my best friend have to join the club in order to participate in matches?

You do not have to be a member to participate in matches. They may enter on weekends when the gate is manned. During the week for special occasions they must be escorted as a guest.

Does PMRPC offer classes? How do I sign up?

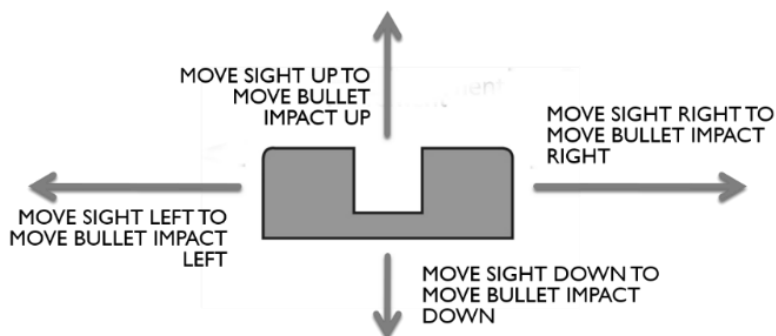

HANDGUN SIGHTING

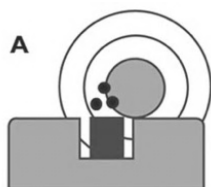
The rear sight is moved in the same direction as the shooter wants their hits on the target to move.

Remember F.O.R.S: FRONT OPPOSITE, REAR SAME.

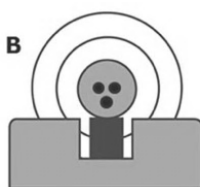


SIGHT ALIGNMENT is **MORE** critical than **SIGHT PICTURE**.

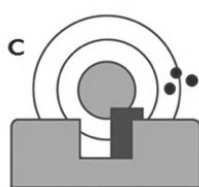
Proper **SIGHT PICTURE** is obtained when the aligned sights are put into their proper relationship with the target.



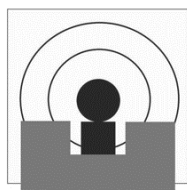
SIGHT PICTURE ERROR YIELDS A SLIGHTLY OFF-CENTER GROUP.



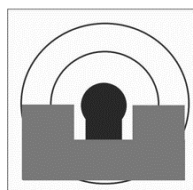
PROPER SIGHT ALIGNMENT AND SIGHT PICTURE

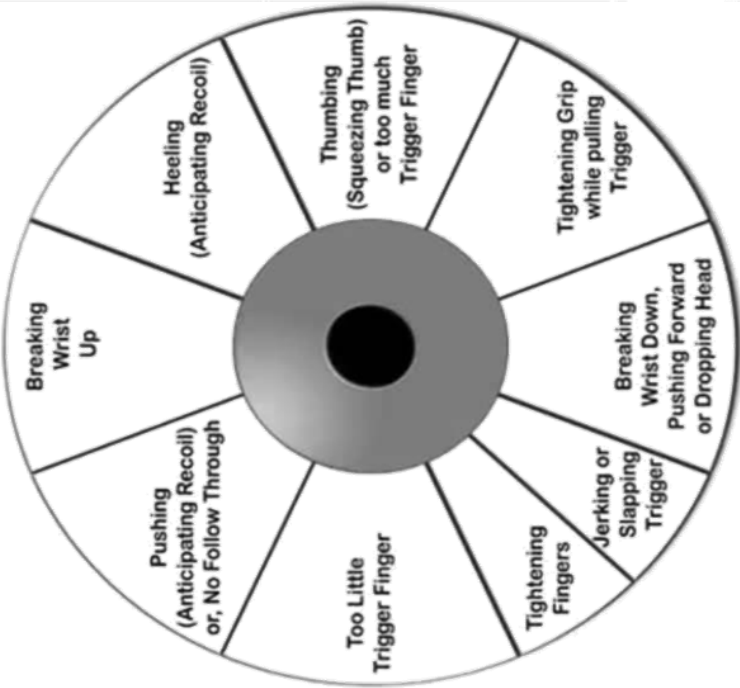

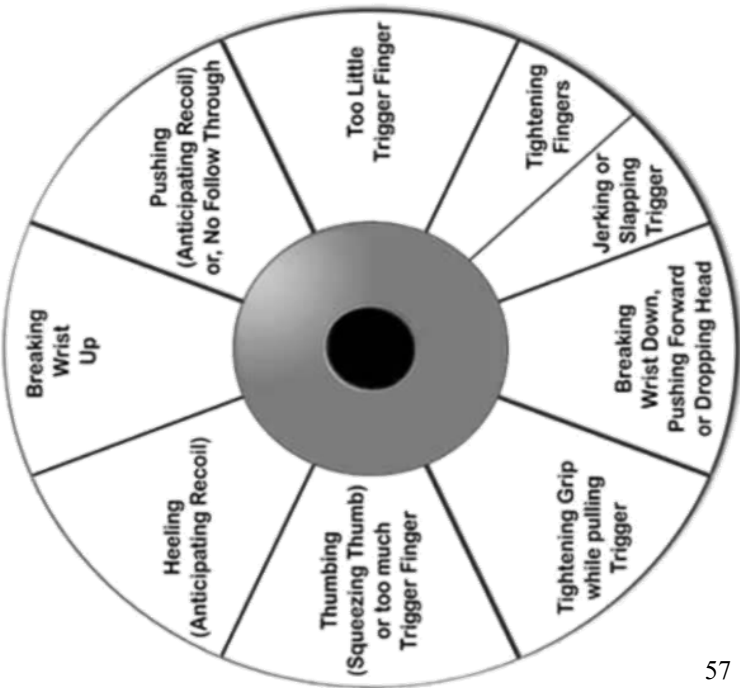

Rifle Sighting

Zeroing is the process of adjusting the sights so that the point of aim (POA) coincides with the point of impact (POI) at a given distance. If you zero your rifle for 100 yards, you can be dead-on at any other distance by raising your sights a set amount, often referred to as "come-ups." The come-ups are specific to an individual rifle and the load it is firing. Come-ups are listed in Minutes of Angle (MOA).

Some standard come-ups:

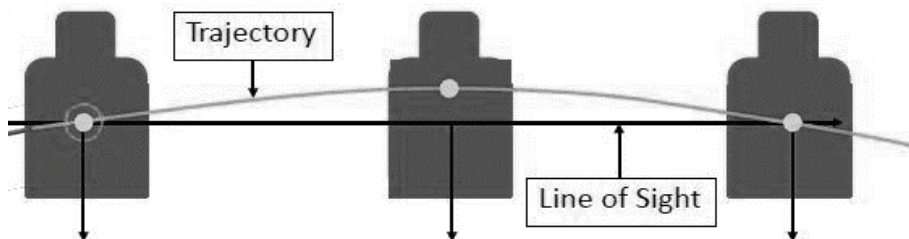
There's another way to zero your rifle: Battle-sight Zero. Because all bullets travel in an arc, the

POI will intersect the POA twice – once as it rises, and once as it falls. The highest point in the arc is referred to as the "maximum ordinate."

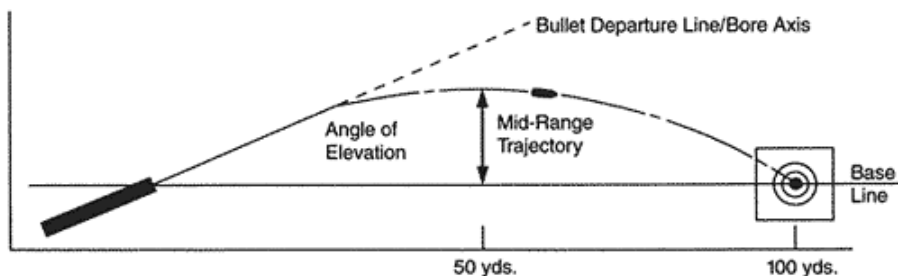
So, if you zero your 5.56 caliber rifle for 25 yards, the trajectory's maximum ordinate will be about 9" high at 200 yards, and dead-on at 300. If you zero for 50 yards, the maximum ordinate will be about 4.5" high and you'll be dead-on at 200 yards.



Trajectory

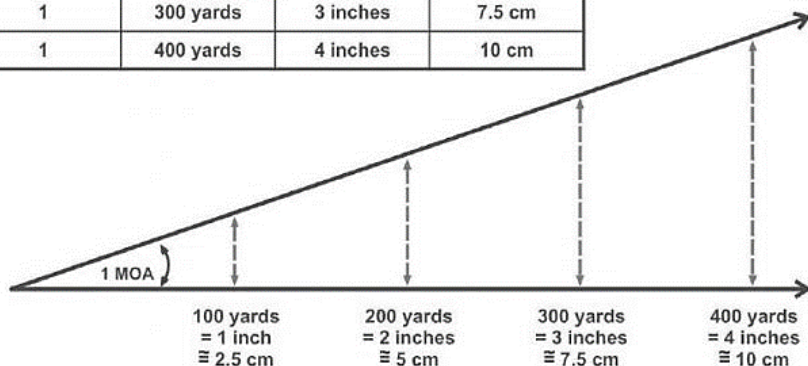
WHEN USING RESTS OR BIPODS UNDERSTANDING TRAJECTORY IS VERY IMPORTANT. MAKE SURE TO KEEP YOUR FIREARM HORIZONTAL AT ALL TIME. USE BUTTSTOCK SUPPORTS AS NEEDED.

NEVER POINT YOUR FIREARM OVER THE BERM.

MINUTE OF ANGLE (MOA) Unit of Measurement

There are 360 degrees in a circle.

There are 60 MOA in a degree.

There are 21,600 MOA in a circle.

1 MOA at 100 yards \approx 1 inch.

Smaller measurements of an MOA are described in fractions, not seconds (i.e., 1/2 MOA).

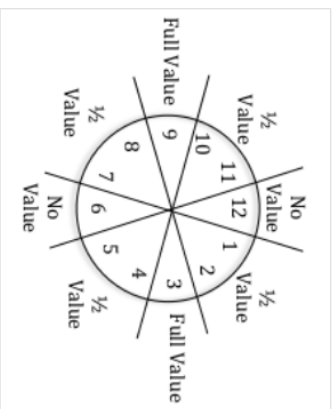
Basic Rifle Scope Sighting

- 1. MAKE SURE** YOUR SCOPE IS INSTALLED PROPERLY
MAKE SURE THAT YOUR SCOPE MOUNT AND RINGS
ARE A PROPER FIT FOR YOUR STYLE OF RIFLE.

Wind Reference Card

0-3 MPH	Hardly felt, causes smoke to drift
3-5 MPH	Felt lightly on face
5-8 MPH	Tree leaves in motion
8-12 MPH	Raises dust and loose paper
12-15 MPH	Small trees start to sway
15-20 MPH	Large trees start to sway

.30 Caliber: Range in hundreds of yards multiplied by the wind value divided by 10 = MOA correction. **Ex:** $1 \times 10 = 10 \div 10 = 1\text{MOA}$ – or - $5 \times 10 = 50 \div 10 = 5\text{MOA}$

.223 Caliber: Range in hundreds of yards multiplied by the wind value divided by 7 = MOA correction. **Ex:** $1 \times 10 = 10 \div 7 = 1.43\text{MOA}$ – or - $5 \times 10 = 50 \div 7 = 7.14\text{MOA}$

Appleseed's Rule of Thumb: If wind is noticeable (about 10 MPH), correct 1 MOA for every 100 yards of distance -- 3 MOA at 300 yards, etc; 5 MOA at 500 yards.

2. **ADJUST EYE DISTANCE**

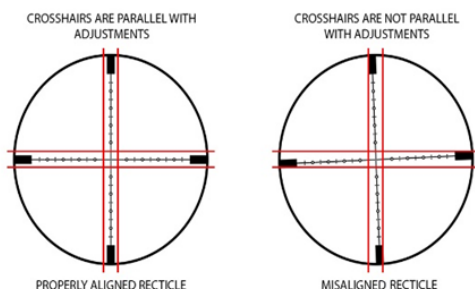
GET YOUR EYEPIECE SITUATED IN SUCH A WAY THAT YOU SEE A CLEAR, DISTINCT IMAGE. THE DISTANCE BETWEEN THE END OF THE SCOPE AND YOUR EYE IS A KEY COMPONENT TO SIGHTING YOUR RIFLE SCOPE.

3. **GET LEVEL**

IN ORDER TO PROPERLY SIGHT YOUR RIFLE'S SCOPE, USE A STABLE REST ON THE BENCH TO ANCHOR THE RIFLE AT TWO POINTS ON THE RIFLE STOCK (NOT RESTING UNDER THE BARREL).

4. **ALIGNING THE RETICLE**

MOST SHOOTERS DO NOT TAKE THE ALIGNMENT OF THEIR RETICLE INTO CONSIDERATION WHEN ZEROING IN THEIR SCOPE. A CANTED RETICLE CAN CAUSE YOUR SHOTS TO MISS RIGHT OR LEFT OF THE TARGET.



5. **SETTING YOUR MOA** (MINUTE OF ANGLE)

SETTING YOUR ZERO IS A MULTI-STEP PROCESS. MOST RIFLE SCOPES WILL THEN ALLOW YOU TO ADJUST THE CROSSHAIRS IN $\frac{1}{4}$ MOA (MINUTE OF ANGLE) INCREMENTS. THIS EQUATES TO $\frac{1}{4}$ " OF MOVEMENT PER CLICK WHEN SIGHTING IN AT 100 YARDS.

IN ORDER TO MAKE THE BULLET IMPACT MOVE ONE INCH OR ONE MOA AT 100 YARDS, YOU MUST TURN THE ELEVATION, OR THE WINDAGE KNOB, FOUR CLICKS. THE CLICK VALUE MOVES UP BY A $\frac{1}{4}$ INCH FOR EACH 100-YARD INCREASE IN DISTANCE. (200 YARDS = $\frac{1}{2}$ IN.)

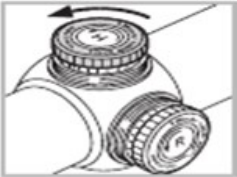
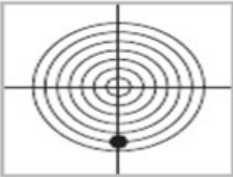
6. **FIRE THREE-SHOT GROUPS**

FIRE THREE-SHOT GROUPS THEN TAKE NOTE OF WHERE THESE GROUPS LAND ON THE TARGET. KNOWING YOUR MOA WILL ALLOW YOU TO ADJUST TO TARGETS AT DIFFERENT DISTANCES.

7. **KEEP TWEAKING**

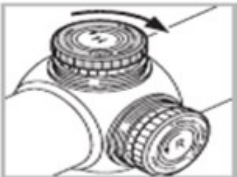
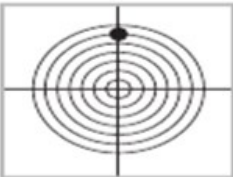

Rifle Shooting Positions

THERE ARE FOUR BASIC DIFFERENT SHOOTING POSITIONS: PRONE, KNEELING, SITTING AND STANDING.

PRONE POSITION: THE PRONE POSITION IS THE MOST ACCURATE OF THE FOUR; PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION TO THE MUZZLE OF YOUR RIFLE AS THERE IS GREATER RISK THAT IT WILL CONTACT THE GROUND AND MAY BECOME LODGED WITH DIRT OR MUD. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO STAND UP WHILE HOLDING THE RIFLE. BEFORE RISING, PLACE IT ON THE GROUND, STAND, THEN PICK UP THE RIFLE, AGAIN PAYING SPECIAL ATTENTION TO THE MUZZLE.



The prone position with both legs straight can be more comfortable for some people.



The prone position with right knee raised towards the torso



The right knee has been raised too high and is likely cause discomfort in the back and legs

KNEELING POSITION: FOR THE KNEELING POSITION, THE REAR KNEE IS PLACED ON THE GROUND; THE OTHER LEG SUPPORTS THE ELBOW OF THE FORWARD ARM. THE ELBOW SHOULD NOT BE PLACED ON THE KNEECAP, BONE TO BONE, AS THIS WILL CAUSE YOU TO WOBBLE. THE ELBOW SHOULD BE PLACED ON MUSCLE, USUALLY THE QUADRICEPS.



SITTING: IN THE SITTING POSITION, BOTH ARMS ARE SUPPORTED. THE SAME CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO AVOID ELBOW TO KNEECAP CONTACT. YOU CAN SIT WITH YOUR LEGS APART OR CROSSED. YOU CAN ALSO WRAP YOUR ARM AROUND YOUR KNEE AND REST THE FORESTOCK ON THE MUSCLES OF YOUR BENT ARM.



STANDING: SHOOTER IN STANDING POSITION WITH NO SUPPORT OTHER THAN MUSCLE STRENGTH, IS THE MOST DIFFICULT POSITION FOR ACCURATE SHOOTING. YOU SHOULD STAND PERPENDICULAR TO THE TARGET WITH YOUR FEET ROUGHLY SHOULDER WIDTH APART. FOR A RIGHT-HANDED SHOOTER, THE LEFT HAND HOLDS THE FORESTOCK, ELBOW POINTING DOWN. THE RIGHT HAND HOLDS THE GRIP, ELBOW POINTING OUT, BUT NOT EXAGGERATED. THE BUTT OF THE RIFLE SHOULD BE SNUG AGAINST YOUR SHOULDER. REMEMBER TO KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL READY TO FIRE.



Hasty Sling

ONE WAY TO STEADY SHOTS WHEN YOU DON'T HAVE REST IS BY USING YOUR RIFLE SLING TO CREATE TENSION BETWEEN YOUR ARM AND THE RIFLE. THIS TECHNIQUE IS CALLED THE "HASTY SLING" AND CAN BE EMPLOYED IN EACH OF THE FOUR SHOOTING POSITIONS. AS WITH THE SHOOTING POSITIONS.



1 Adjust sling so the distance between the bottom of the trigger guard and the sling is equal to one hand width.



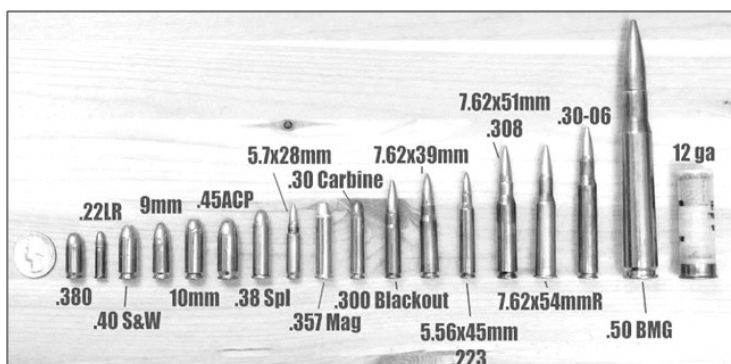
2 Place the support arm through the sling. Move the sling up as high as possible inside the arm.



3 Move the support hand back outside the sling and up to the rifle so the sling is tight against the back of the support wrist.

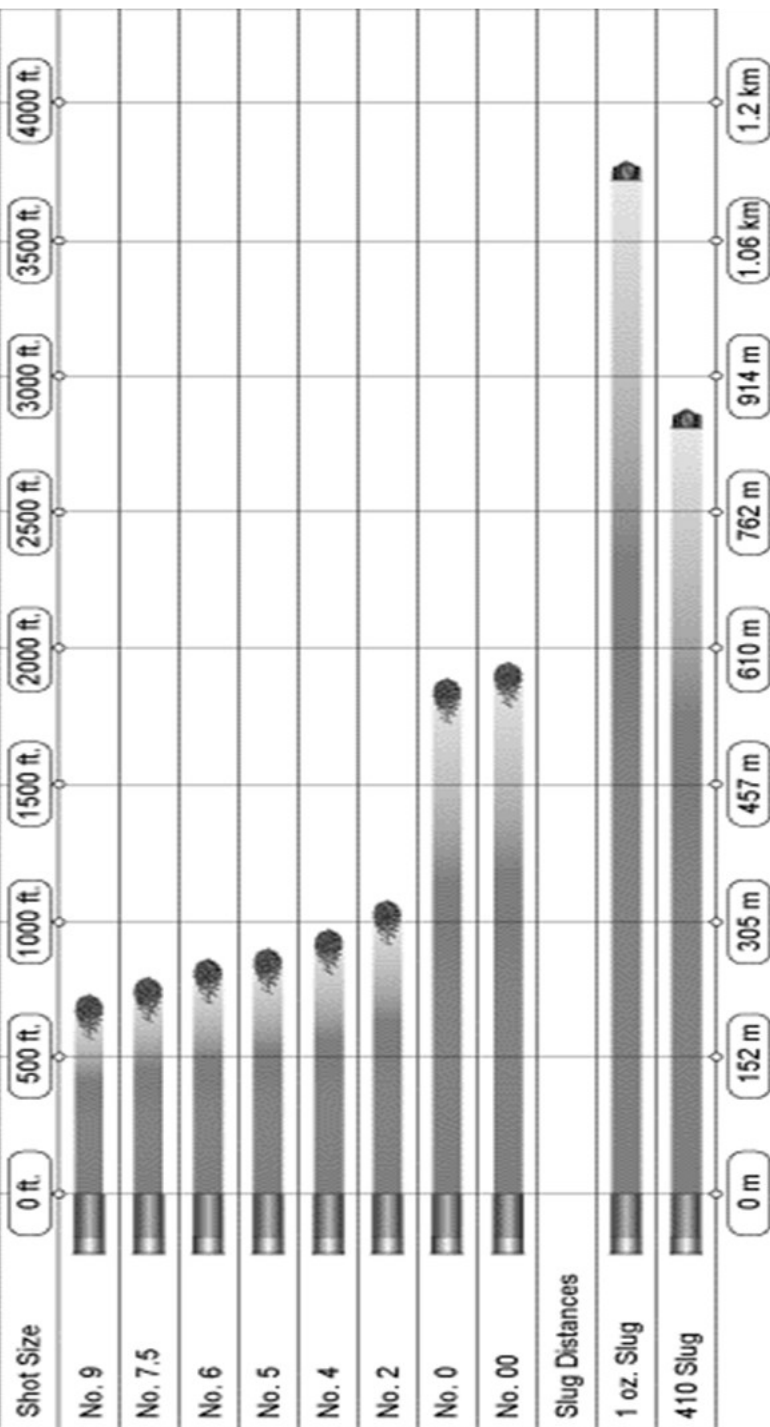


4 The sling is tight against the top of the pectoral muscle and back of the wrist, supporting the rifle. The firing hand doesn't bear any weight.



Different Shot Sizes Travel Different Distances

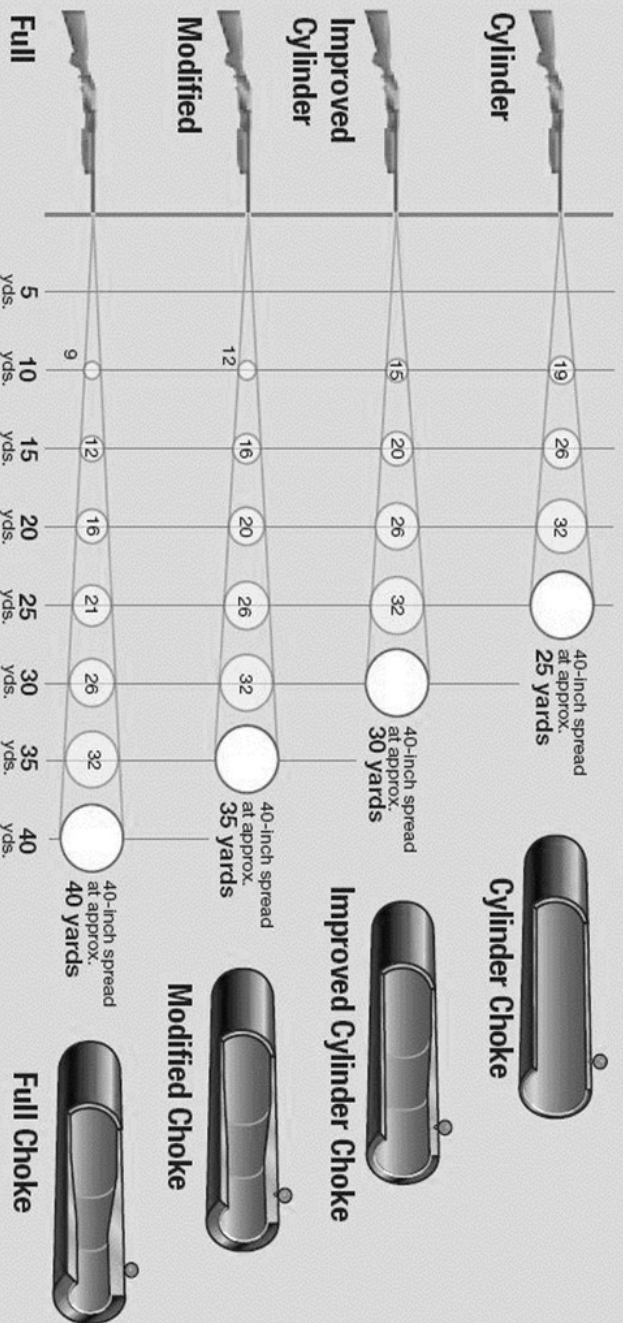
Projectile tip illustrates full dangerous range

Circles represent the diameter of a lead shot string (in inches) as distance (in yards) increases.

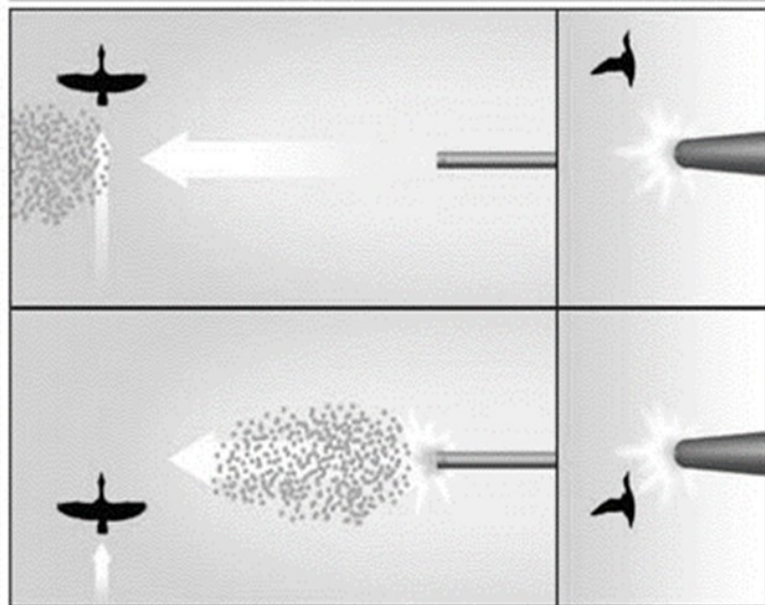
Bore narrowing is exaggerated for clarity.

Shooters who fire at a bird or only slightly ahead...

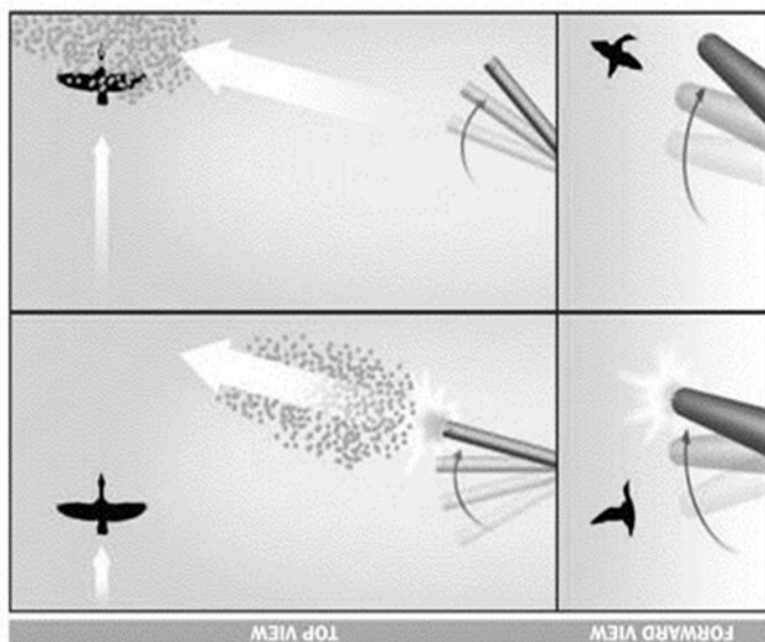
...end up missing or wounding because most of the shot string ends up behind the bird.
